Mayor Cagas called the Worksession Meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. The Clerk advised that pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act Annual Notice of the meeting had been provided to *The Record, the Herald and News* and by posting the Annual Notice on the bulletin board in the clerk's office where notices are customarily posted. Mayor Cagas led the flag salute. The Municipal Clerk called the roll. All members are present. Mr. Regan arrived at 7:46 PM.

Anthony Condemni- Condemni Motor Company- March 5, 2013- Boswell Engineering Meeting Request- On a motion made by Gary Brugger and seconded by Bill Regan all were in favor of accepting this correspondence and placing it on file. Mayor Cagas announces he is happy to meet with Mr. Condemni.

Clean All Cleaners- March 5, 2013- Appeal Sewer Usage Charge 2013- 289 Huyler Street. Block 39 Lot 16- On a motion made by Gary Brugger and seconded by Frank Cagas all were in favor of accepting this correspondence based on the tax collectors recommendation.

Old Business

COAH Housing Trust Fund- Planner Authorization (Kauker & Kauker)- David Nasta, Township Attorney explains to the Committee the balance of the trust fund account and the amount allowed for administrative fees and the balance will go to the rehabilitation of homes in the Township. ***On the question-*** Vincent Stefano asks what the planner has worked on to date & asks if he has met the 20% benchmark?

Receipt of Bid- Co-Location Huyler Street Cellular Monopole-

BIDDER: New York SMSA Limited Partnership D/B/A-Verizon Wireless
BID DATE: February 28, 2013 10:00 – David Nasta explains that this is for lease with T-Mobile and how it can generate up to \$13,000.00 annually to the Township. On a motion made by Gary Brugger and Seconded by Bill Regan; all were in favor of having the Township Attorney prepare a resolution to award Verizon Wireless as for the co-location on the Huyler Street Monopole.

Fire Zones- Mayor Cagas notes that this matter was already discussed.

CDBG Handicapped Improvements to the Senior Center- Accept or Reject Project- Gary Brugger explains that the senior center does not want to move forward this project as it will force the woman's room to lose a stall and suggests again that the work be done by the township if it pleases the rest of the committee. Gary Brugger motions to reject this grant money for the senior center; Walter Eckel seconds the motion and all were in favor to look into the matter of using the money elsewhere if possible.

NJ Meadowlands Tax Sharing- Discussion- Gary Brugger explains the last meeting he attended and how we may have to join in the litigation. He states the 3 million dollars not distributed correctly and fairly by the state and reminds the Township Committee of the situation in Jersey City regarding the 20 year tax abatement. (Payer towns need to be unified and to do everything possible to fight the unfairness in the tax sharing.)

New Business

Department of Public Works Proficiency and Evaluation- Discussion- On a motion made by Gary Brugger and seconded by Bill Regan all were in favor of forming a subcommittee for this matter. It shall consist of Mayor Frank Cagas and Walter Eckel. David Nasta explains this matter as a whole review of the Department of Public Works. In 18 months our CPWM, Larry Paladino will retire and we want to be ahead of the game by exploring an inter-local with other towns. This review will include labor, building use and possible CPWM license sharing. Gary Brugger asks a salt shed can be shared.

Accept Vehicle Checklist for Police Department- On a motion made by Bill Regan and seconded by Gary Brugger all were in favor of approving this checklist for the police department.

DEP 31- Discussion- The Township Clerk explains that DEP 31 is Dependent Care for Township employee's dependants who reach age off the Township health insurance at age 26. This option would allow them to stay on our policy until age 31. This option mirrors the State Health Benefits Plan and the dependant would be responsible for payment to the insurance company directly. There are restrictions to the qualifications for this option which would be explained by the BMED; a resolution is needed to adopt this option to the townships health plan.

Local Mayors/Municipal Representatives Trip to Washington DC regarding FEMA Mitigation for Marcellus Street Bridge- Mayor Cagas explains this trip is needed so local governments can be represented in DC and hopes Washington approves the FEMA mitigation request to help elevate the flooding from the Saddle River. Bill Regan volunteers to go with the Mayor if need be.

Above ground storage tanks- action item- Discussion- It is determined by the Township Committee that this item does not apply to South Hackensack and we do not have underground piping.

Police Department Satellite Office in Memorial School- Discussion- Police Chief Michael Frew explains why he is suggesting this request. He advises that Sgt. Licamara would work well there as a juvenile officer. This will add more security for parents, teachers and children. He will need a computer, phone, desk and filing cabinets for him to be able to do his work at Memorial School. Bill Regan states that he is seeing more and more towns having man power at their schools. He commends Sgt. Licamara and recognizes the bonds he has with the school children. Chief Frew states that Dr. Defabiis is all in favor of having an officer between the hours of 7:30 am-3:30 pm. He also recommends an officer go on local school trips. Frank Cagas states that more police man power will be needed in Garfield Park as well.

Safety Issue- End of Dyer Avenue- Discussion- Mayor Cagas explains that on Dyer Avenue there is an opening in the fence by AEP and people are cutting through at all hours of the night and the Township Committee should take action before it is too late. Bill Regan explains that he lives on this street and his wife has been startled many times by strangers using his property to walk through. The fence is not high enough at the end of Dyer. Ray DeRiso explains the zoning code and how the fence may be grandfathered if the ordinance is changed. Vinny Stefano suggests sending a letter to AEP to see if they will have their employees stop using Dyer Avenue as a short cut. Police Chief Michael Frew asks if the Township can replace the fence as it is in our right of way? Gary Brugger states that AEP will be moving out of that building soon and new tenants may move in. Frank Cagas suggests a guard rail along Phillips Avenue by AEP. Vinny Stefano suggest that the police stop the people from jumping over the fence. Police Chief Michael Frew asks the Township to get quotes to replace the fence. Larry Paladino, DPW Superintendent agrees. Ray DeRiso suggests that the landlord be contacted and made aware of the situation ASAP. Bill Regan asks for direction from the council.

Gary Brugger motioned for introduction of Ordinance No. 2013-02; seconded by Bill Regan. Roll Call Vote Affirmative: Brugger, Cagas, Eckel, Regan & Stefano. Public Hearing scheduled for April 4, 2013.

Resolutions

- Closed Executive Session – On a motion made by Gary Brugger and seconded by Bill Regan all were favor.

- Resolution No. 2013-076- Appoint Alternate Crossing Guard- Jennifer Ali- On a motion made by Gary Brugger and seconded by Walter Eckel; all voted in favor of this resolution by a roll call vote.
- Resolution No. 2013- 077- Marcellus Street Bridge recommendation- On a motion made by Gary Brugger and seconded by Walter Eckel; all voted in favor of this resolution by a roll call vote.

Committee Reports-

Gary Brugger- Reports on the Ambulance Corps Fundraisers. They will have a boot drive, carwash & is requesting to hang up a banner if possible. He notes that he wants everything done above board and asks if there is a formal agreement with the Township and Ambulance Corps? David Nasta advises that is done through an ordinance and not established by contract. Gary Brugger suggests a subcommittee be formed to look into the future of third party billing with the Ambulance Corps. Mayor Cagas appoints a sub- committee of Gary Brugger and Bill Regan. Mr. Brugger comments on the amount of tax appeals the Township is faced with currently. A discussion ensues with Ray DeRiso and members of the public on a possible re-assessment of the Township. This would hopefully lower everyone's assessment and we would have less tax appeals. Mr. Brugger asks the Township Clerk to invite George Reggo to the next council meeting.

Bill Regan-Reports that the Easter Show will be on March 22, 2013 & it will be a new show. The Easter egg hunt is on March 30, 2013 @ 11:00AM. Announces good news that the Cheerleaders won the state championship at Farleigh Dickerson University. Suggests the Township Committee should invite them to a meeting to honor them. Mr. Regan also reported that he spoke with our webmaster and hopes to bring the website more up to date in the future if the budget allows.

Walter Eckel- Asks when the lights will be fixed on Phillips Avenue? Thanks Larry Paladino for doing a good job salting last month. Requests a status report on the generator for the Fire House and for Town Hall.

Frank Cagas- Thanks everyone who attended the bus trip for the Fire Department fund raiser. Comments that it was a nice event that should be done more often. Reports that he believes the donation of the tree for Arbor Day is a great idea. Frank Cagas directs Larry Paladino get 3 price quotes for the Dyer Avenue fence by AEP.

Vincent Stefano- Agrees that we are taking a big hit with tax appeals and something has to be done for the future of the Township. Wants to discuss a 5 year plan. Agrees that sharing services with another municipality is good benefit. Does not want to see anyone here lose their job but wants to stop re-acting to problems as they come up. Wants to keep services local and not regional.

David Nasta, Township Attorney- Reports that he will review the current fence ordinance and will propose changes to the Township Committee.

Public Comments

Larry Paladino, DPW Superintendent- Agrees 100% with Vinny Stefano and does not want to see anyone lose their job. Suggests a department head meeting so everyone can work together. Wants to see the DPW advance towards the future.

Dolly Montenegro, 57 Phillips Avenue- Recommends that the tiles should be fixed in the senior center bathrooms and not use the grant money for ADA improvements. She will report back with prices. Dolly suggests we make a deal with a real estate broker for redevelopment of Green Street. Gives examples of what her father did in the past with Klatson and Hansen. Reports on the Fire Department Trip (fundraiser to Sands Casino)- She would like to see the Mayor present the \$700.00 check to the Fire Department. Discusses the plaque at the school dedicated to her father and summarized the consolidation of both Fire Departments into one. Dolly asks about third party billing with the Ambulance Corps and wonders if residents would be stuck with a bill. A discussion ensues and the answer to her question is NO.

Chief Michael Frew- Comments on the safety issue at Dyer Avenue along with his concerns for third party billing with the Ambulance Corps.

Mr. Nasta, Jr.- 45 Kingsley Street- States that we rear yard pick up and residents should not be putting their cans in the front of the property. Has no problem with rear yard pick-up. Asks the Township Committee when his street light will be fixed and expresses concerns with DPW shared services and third party billing with the Ambulance Corps. He comments about the safety issues regarding the fence at the end of Dyer Avenue. (people should not be using it as a cut-through).

Loni Bedell- 51 Grove Street- Reports on the last Freeholder's Meeting & the Meadowlands Meeting. Speaks about Tax Sharing & reminds the Township Committee that senior citizens are paying out of pocket for their library cards. Questions Kauker & Kauker and we should listen to our municipal attorney regarding this matter.

Kim Rerecich, Dyer Avenue- Comments on the Dyer Avenue fence problem and has concerns that a slatted fence may be dangerous for children. She states that she is walker and asks if there is a way to still have public access if the fence is replaced. Reports that the garbage company litters cans on her street.

Closed Session

On a motion made by Vincent Stefano and Seconded by Walter Eckel all were in favor of entering into closed executive session at 9:30PM.

The minutes of the closed session will be released when authorized by the governing body and permitted by law.

Resolution Authorizing Executive Session- March 7, 2013

A Resolution Providing for a Meeting Not Open to the Public in Accordance with the Provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12.

Whereas, the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack is subject to certain requirements of the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6*, et seq., and

Whereas, the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12*, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution, and

Whereas, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b and designated below:

_____(1) *Matters Required by Law to be Confidential*: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.

_____(2) *Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds*: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.

_____(3) *Matters Involving Individual Privacy*: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

XX (4) *Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements*: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

Police Contract Negotiations

 (5) *Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds*: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.

 (6) *Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property*: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.

XX (7) *Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege*: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

**RESOLUTION NO. 2013-077
MARCELLUS STREET BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT BY THE COUNTY OF BERGEN**

WHEREAS, The Saddle River flows through eight communities in Bergen County (Fair Lawn, Paramus, Rochelle Park, Saddle Brook, Lodi, Garfield, Wallington and South Hackensack), and

WHEREAS, during catastrophic weather events such as Hurricane Irene and most recently Super Storm Sandy these events cause significant destruction to South Hackensack's infrastructure and to the property of our residents, and

WHEREAS, because of the lack of Federal, State and county governments and the Passaic Valley Sewer Authority assistance in maintaining a free flowing path for the current of the Saddle River, and

WHEREAS, because these four Government bodies failed to dredge, clear the banks of the river of fallen trees of floating vegetation and other foreign objects that caused these objects to collect at the bridges that straddle Saddle River and the Marcellus Street in particular, and

WHEREAS, all responsible government studies agree that the Marcellus Street Bridge is a major impediment to the free flow of the river. The County Government must provide the necessary funds to correct this problem at once, and

WHEREAS, it is incumbent upon the aforesaid agencies to eliminate all debris from the river and to the best of their abilities correct this horrendous condition. The eight communities deserve nothing less.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Federal, State and County governments and the Passaic Valley Sewer Authority take all steps necessary to eliminate this continuing hazard and:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be sent to our Federal, State and County elected officials.

ORDNANCE NO. 2013-01

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 182 OF
THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK ENTITLED
“SHADE TREES”

Be it Enacted and Ordained, by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack that Chapter 182 entitled “Shade Trees” is amended and supplemented as follows:

SECTION I.

182-2 Definitions:

Diameter at the Point of Measurement is amended as follows:

Circumference at the Point of Measurement: or CPM means the circumference of a tree measured at a point on the tree six (6) inches from ground level on the downhill side.

Regulated Tree- Any tree which has attained at least 30 feet in height or a CPM of at least eight inches prior to any limb removal or other such activity.

Removal- Any activity which results in the cutting down completely or substantially eliminates a living regulated tree from the Township’s tree stock. For purposes of this chapter substantially eliminates shall mean the pruning or removal of more than twenty percent (20%) of the tree including diseased and live branches. Said determination shall be made by the Shade Tree Commission or its representative in their sole and absolute discretion.

Removal Period A period of time beginning on the date of a decision rendered under this chapter requiring action and ending upon a date eight (8) months thereafter.

Replacement Plan- A plan developed in accordance with and conforming to the provisions of this chapter which has been approved by the Shade Tree Commission.

182-3 Cutting or Removal Restricted

With the exception of the exemptions set forth in this chapter no person shall cut, prune or remove or cause to be cut, pruned or removed any regulated tree upon the lands within the Township of South Hackensack unless said cutting, pruning or removal is performed in strict accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

182-5 Project permit application process

A. Project permit application submission: A tree removal project permit application shall be submitted to the Shade Tree Commission.

C. The Shade Tree Commission shall review the application to determine whether such project complies with this chapter and shall provide written notice to the applicant indicating one of the following determinations:

(1) The project permit is granted; or

(2) The project permit is granted subject to the prescribed conditions attached to such notice.

(3) The project permit is denied, in which event the written notice shall state the reasons for said denial and shall advise the applicant of its right to appeal to the

Township Committee within twenty (20) days of said denial. Failure to file an appeal within said time frame shall be deemed a waiver of such right.

D. The Shade Tree Commission shall make the foregoing determination and prepare and furnish the foregoing notices within sixty (60) days following the submission of a complete application.

E. Failure of the Shade Tree Commission to make such determination within the said sixty (60) day period and any extension granted by the applicant shall be deemed an approval of the project.

F. Any proposed change in the approved project shall be submitted to the Shade Tree Commission for approval in the same manner as the original application for approval of the project.

182-6 Tree Replacement Plans (For All New Construction, Additions or Alterations)

E. Any new residential construction shall include a plan for the planting of at least two shade trees approved as to location, type and size by the Shade Tree Commission and shall avoid placement under utility wires and in areas which would be prone to root disturbance of sidewalks or curbs. Any alteration or addition to a residential structure that exceeds five hundred (500) square feet shall include a plan for the planting of at least one shade tree approved as to location, type and size by the Shade Tree Commission.

F. Any plan for new construction or alteration of commercial or industrial building which exceeds five hundred (500) square feet shall include a plan, in addition to the tree replacement plans set forth herein, for the planting of one shade tree for each five hundred square feet of construction up to five thousand square feet and one tree for each one thousand square square feet of new construction or alteration thereafter. The location, type and size of the Shade Tree shall be approved by the Shade Tree Commission.

182-7 Tree replacement fund

In certain circumstances, the Shade Tree Commission may authorize a contribution to the Township's Shade Tree Commission Tree Fund in lieu of planting replacement trees on site where it determines that the purposes of this chapter would be furthered thereby. Such contribution shall bear a reasonable relationship to the cost of planting trees which would otherwise be required under section 182-6 of this chapter but in no case shall be less than \$300 per required tree.

182-10 Fees

B. An escrow shall be established in the minimum amount of \$300 per tree to be removed and replaced or planted in accordance with this chapter which shall be retained until such time that the tree replacement or planting plan is complete. In the event that the tree replacement or planting plan is not completed within eight (8) months

of approval plus any extension granted by the Shade Tree Commission, the Township may use such escrow to complete the tree replacement or planting plan or in lieu thereof deposit said escrow in the Shade Tree Fund.

SECTION II. Severability:

Each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase, and the finding or holding of any such portion of this Ordinance to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause, or reason, shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION III. Repealer:

Any ordinance or portion thereof which is inconsistent with this ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of said inconsistency.

SECTION IV. Effective date:

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2013-02

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 40 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK ENTITLED “OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES”,

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack that the following Chapter of the Municipal Code be amended and supplemented as follows:

Section I: Chapter 40 Article, Chapter 6 “Treasurer and Deputy Treasurer” is hereby amended as follows:

**ARTICLE VI
FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT**

Section 40-17 (Treasurer) and 40-18 (Deputy Treasurer) be and the same are hereby deleted and replaced as follows

Section 40-17- Creation of Offices and Compensation- The Financial Department of the Township of South Hackensack shall consist of a Chief Financial Officer, Accounts Payable Clerk, Payroll Clerk and Assistant to the Chief Financial Officer. Said positions shall be considered part time positions for the purpose of pension and medical benefit laws except in such case where all of the aforementioned titles are filled by one individual in which case at the option of the Township Committee said individual may be hired as a full time employee. Said employees need not be residents of the Township of South Hackensack and no preference shall be given to Township residents for said positions. They shall be compensated at salaries as set forth in the Township salary ordinance and paid in accordance with the terms of the Township’s regular payroll with appropriate deductions funds permitting.

Section 40-18- Appointment and terms- All employees shall be hired in accordance with the terms of the Township’s Personnel Policies and Procedures manual and subject to any applicable state laws regarding tenure, licensing (if required) or other regulations.

Section 40-19 Functions of office-

N. The Accounts Payable Clerk under the supervision of the Chief Financial Officer said employee shall be responsible for the review of all requests for payment of municipal funds, preparation and/or review of vouchers and supporting documentation related to payment requests, preparation of the bill list for review and approval by the governing body, banking transactions associated with said payments and the proper maintenance of books and records related to all transactions.

O. The Assistant to the Chief Financial Officer shall perform such duties as from time to time shall be assigned by the Chief Financial Officer. They shall include but not be limited to preparing documentation as directed by the Chief Financial Officer and undertaking such tasks necessary to ensure that the Chief Financial Officer properly administers the financial affairs of the Township.

P. The Payroll clerk shall be responsible for the providing proper information to any private payroll agency retained by the Township to ensure proper payment of all employee wages and proper deductions therefrom. The payroll clerk shall ensure that all books and records are kept in accordance with law and all wages are properly delivered. The payroll clerk may be designated by the Township Committee to prepare payroll in the event that the Township Committee does not retain or employ an independent entity for purposes of the same.
