#### Resolution Authorizing Executive Session November 10, 2016

A Resolution Providing for a Meeting Not Open to the Public in Accordance with the Provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4–12.

Whereas, the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack is subject to certain requirements of the *Open Public Meetings Act*, *N.J.S.A.* 10:4–6, et seq., and

Whereas, the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A.* 10:4–12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution, and

Whereas, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4–12b and designated below:

- (1) Matters Required by Law to be Confidential: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
- \_\_\_\_(2) Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.
- (3) Matters Involving Individual Privacy: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation,

insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

- \_\_\_\_\_(4) Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.
- (5) Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.
- \_\_\_\_\_(6) Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.
- XX (7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the <u>Attorney-Client Privilege</u>: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is require in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

XX (8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.

(9) Matters relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack assembled in public session on this date, that an Executive Session closed to the public shall be held in the South Hackensack Township Municipal Complex, 227 Phillips Avenue, South Hackensack, New Jersey, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designated above.

It is anticipated that the deliberations conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Committee that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2016-07

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 82 ENTITLED "ANIMALS", ARTICLE IV ENTITLED "WILDLIFE" OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack, State of New Jersey, that Chapter 82 of the Code of the Township of South Hackensack existing Article IV entitled "Wildlife", Sections 82-26 through 82-27 shall be deleted in its entirety and shall be replaced with the following:

### ARTICLE III Wildlife General Provisions

#### **SECTION 82-26.** Purpose.

The purpose of this section is to prohibit the feeding of unconfined wildlife in the Township of South Hackensack, so as to protect the health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for failure to comply. It has been well established that the feeding of wild animals is both detrimental to the animals and causes a public health nuisance and safety hazard that is detrimental to the health and welfare of the general public.

#### **SECTION 82-27.** Definitions.

- a. For the purpose of this section, the following terms, phrases, words and their deviations shall have the meaning stated herein unless their use in the text of this section clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, the words used in the present tense include the future, words used in plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.
  - b. As used in this section, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:
- Feed To give, place, expose, deposit, distribute or scatter any edible material with the intention of feeding, attracting or enticing wildlife. Feeding does not include baiting in the legal taking of fish and/or game.

Person - Any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, or political subdivision of this state subject to municipal jurisdiction.

Stray animal - Includes any dog or cat that is not licensed to a South Hackensack resident pursuant to the Code of the Township of South Hackensack, and kept and maintained on the resident's property.

Wildlife - All animals that are neither human nor domesticated and shall include but not be limited to pigeons, waterfowl, raccoons, skunks or groundhogs.

Wild Animals - Any animal, which is not normally domesticated in this state, including but not limited to bears, coyotes, deer, feral cats, foxes, groundhogs, opossums, raccoons, skunks, and waterfowl and any domesticated unlicensed animal, including but not limited to stray cats and dogs.

#### **SECTION 82-28.** Prohibited conduct.

- a. No person shall place food intended or suitable for consumption by wildlife or stray animals on any property, public or private, in the Township Of South Hackensack.
  - b. This prohibition shall not be applied to enclosed, elevated bird feeders.

#### **SECTION 82-29.** Enforcement.

- a. This section shall be enforced by the Police Department, Code Enforcement Officer, Animal Control Officer and/or a Health Officer of the Township of South Hackensack.
- b. Any person found to be in violation of this section shall be ordered to cease the feeding immediately.

#### **SECTION 82-30.** Permitted conduct.

1. Feeding of songbirds and other backyard birds shall be permitted at such times and upon such conditions so that the feeding:

- a. Does not create an unreasonable disturbance that affects the rights of surrounding property owners or render other persons insecure in the use of their property.
- b. Does not create an accumulation of droppings on the property or surrounding properties.
  - c. Does not become an attractant for rodents or other wild animals.
- 2. Each property owner shall be permitted to have one bird feeder for every 7,500 square feet of lot area, not closer than 5 feet from any property line.
  - a. Bird Feeder: A bird feeder shall be either:
    - i. a tube or cylinder
- ii. a hopper type feeder, which shall be fully enclosed on all sides with an opening of no more than ½ inch in size.

Bird Feeders shall be suspended or mounted less than four (4) feet and no more than eight (8) feet from the ground. Bird feeders shall be filled with no more than two gallons of feed at any time.

- b. Suet, is a formulation of animal fat and other ingredients in cake or brick form. Suet shall be placed in either mesh bag, or wire cage and suspended or mounted no less than four (4) feet and no more than eight (8) feet from the ground.
- c. No bird seed or any form of bird food shall be thrown or scattered on the ground of any property. No suet shall be smeared on any tree.

#### **SECTION 82-31.** Violations and penalties.

Any person that shall violate any of the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, for each offense, pay a penalty of not less than \$250 nor more than \$500 for the first offense and a penalty of not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$1,500 for second and subsequent offenses, or imprisonment or community service for a period not exceeding 90 days.

#### SECTION 82-32. Severability.

Each subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this section is declared to be an independent subsection, sentence, clause and phrase, and the finding or holding of any such portion of this section to be unconstitutional, void or ineffective for any cause or reason, shall not affect any other portion of this section.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication according to law.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 2016-06**

### AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING CHAPTER 75 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK ENTITLED "RAPID ENTRY BOX SYSTEMS"

**WHEREAS**, the South Hackensack Volunteer Fire Department and the South Hackensack Fire Official have advised that it is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare to require

all commercial property owners as described herein to install a rapid entry box system; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee agrees with the recommendations of the Fire Department and its officials that a rapid entry system will protect the health and safety of the certain business owners, patrons, firefighters and first responders.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack that Chapter 75 of the Municipal Code is hereby created and established.

**SECTION I:** Chapter 75 of the Code of the Township of South Hackensack entitled "Rapid Entry

Box Systems" be and is hereby created and shall read as follows:

#### Chapter 75 RAPID ENTRY BOX SYSTEMS.

#### 75-1 Purpose.

The Governing Body of the Township of South Hackensack finds that in order to better protect the property and welfare of certain businesses, business patrons and Fire Company members, a uniform system for rapid entry into certain buildings in the event of a report of a fire emergency is required. (

#### 75-2 Applicability.

- a. The following structures or buildings shall be required to have installed a rapid entry box system.
  - 1. Any industrial or warehouse building or structure.
  - 2. Hotels, motels or multiple dwellings which have locked main entrances at any time during the day or night or which have locked boiler rooms, electrical rooms, basements, sprinkler control rooms or elevator control rooms.
  - 3. All educational and day-care buildings or structures.
  - 4. All mercantile buildings and structures including shopping centers.
  - 5. All office buildings and structures.
  - 6. All buildings and structures of public assembly including houses of worship and restaurants.

#### 75-3 Definitions.

a. The following words used in this section shall have the meanings set forth below unless the context in which it is used clearly requires a different meaning:

Affected structures or affected buildings shall mean any of the structures or buildings described in subsection 75-2 above.

Multiple dwellings shall mean a residential building containing three (3) or more dwelling units.

Rapid entry box system shall mean a locking vault-like container permanently mounted into the affected structure or building and accessible from outside of such structure or building.

#### 75-4 Type of Rapid Entry Box Required.

Each affected building or structure shall cause an appropriate rapid entry box to be permanently mounted into the structure or building and accessible from outside the structure or building. Each rapid entry box shall be of sufficient size and configuration to allow the required contents as set forth below to be conveniently stored therein. In order to assure acceptability of the rapid entry box chosen, each owner, tenant, or other responsible party of each affected structure or building shall receive approval from the South Hackensack Fire Official as to the size, type and configuration of the proposed rapid entry box.

#### 75-5 Location Requirements.

The location on the outside of the building or structure at which the rapid entry box is to be located must be, as nearly as possible, uniform in order to promote quick accessibility upon arrival of fire personnel at the scene of an emergency. Given differing structural characteristics of different types of structures and buildings, the location of the rapid entry box on the exterior of each building or structure shall be submitted to and approved by the Township Fire Official.

#### 75-6 Required Contents of Rapid Entry Box.

The rapid entry box for each building or structure shall contain a separately and clearly labeled key for each locked area within the building or structure (for example, boiler rooms, electrical rooms, sprinkler control rooms, elevator control rooms, etc.), the building plan of any structure or building in excess of thirty thousand (30,000) square feet, sprinkler keys, elevator keys, and information concerning any hazardous materials contained with the building or structure, and a clear indication as to the part of the building or structure within such hazardous materials are contained.

#### 75-7 Compliance Deadline.

Compliance with the provisions of this section must be achieved on or before May 31, 2017.

#### 75-8 Master Key Security.

As used herein, "master key" shall mean the instrument used to gain access to the various rapid entry system boxes to be utilized as a result of the provisions of this section. The Fire Department shall establish a system of security and procedures to limit access to any master key(s) to authorized personnel in times of emergency. The Fire Department shall, to the extent feasible and practical, use the latest technological advances available to preserve and enhance the security of the master key(s).

#### 75-9 Violations and Penalties.

Violation of the provisions of this section shall be punishable by a one hundred (\$500.00) dollar fine for the first offense and a five hundred (\$1000.00) dollar fine for each subsequent offense. All enforcement of this section will be conducted by the Fire Official or his designated Fire Inspectors, Fire Chief, and Fire Sub-code Official.

**SECTION II:** All ordinances or any part thereof that is inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of said inconsistency.

**SECTION III:** If any portion of this ordinance is found to be unconstitutional or in violation of law the remainder of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION IV:** This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law with initial compliance with same no later then January 15, 2017.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 2016-08**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 208 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK ENTITLED "ZONING"

**WHEREAS**, consistent with the Township Committee's intend to encourage business and property redevelopment they have seen fit to review the parking requirements attributable to Houses of Worship; and

**WHEREAS**, as a result of the aforesaid review the Township Committee has determined that the Township's zoning ordinance for the aforesaid use is inconsistent with the requirements necessary for a sanctuary within Houses of Worship:

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED,** by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack that Chapter 208 "Zoning" be amended and supplemented as follows:

**Section I:** Chapter 208-8 "M District – Mixed Use Zone" shall be amended as follows:

#### 208-8(B) Area and Yard Requirements

#### (3) All Other Permitted Uses-Off Street Parking Requirements:

**Houses of Worship-** One space for every 3 seats in the sanctuary. Houses of Worship shall also be permitted to rely upon un-utilized parking spaces from directly adjacent and abutting properties subject to a formal written agreement with said property owner(s). Said agreement shall bind all parties thereto, shall be subject to the review of the Township's police, fire and safety officials. Any parking spaces utilized under the terms of this section shall be used by only one property owner at any given time to avoid duplication, parking shortage and inconsistency with this zoning code. The terms of any such days and times of usage shall be specified in the aforementioned parking agreement which shall become part of any approval of the use of said properties and shall be identified by signage upon the affected property.

**Section II:** All ordinance or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of said inconsistency.

**Section III:** If any portion of this ordinance is found to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction the remainder of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

**Section IV:** This ordinance shall take effect after referral to the South Hackensack Planning Board as required by law and upon passage and publication as required by law.
