### Call of Meeting to Order

Mayor Anzevino called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. He advised that pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act Annual Notice of the meetings had been provided to *The Record*, *The Herald and News* and by posting the Annual Notice on the bulletin board in the clerk's office where notices are customarily posted. Everyone saluted the flag. The municipal clerk called the roll.

### Correspondence & Reports

Cagas motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept correspondence dated December 7, 2009, from Dennis Reycraft, New Business Manager Re: Invest#52564-Schriefer Street Main Extension-Install 185 feet of 6 inch ductile iron pipe, and refer the matter to Boswell Engineering for their review.

Anzevino motioned; Cagas seconded to accept correspondence dated December 17, 2009, from Lawrence J. Paladino, Jr., CPWM, Supt. Re: Extra manpower snow plowing and instructed him to obtain additional quotes for the service from other vendors.

Eckel motioned; Anzevino seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept and approve correspondence dated December 31, 2009, from Mary Terraccino, Deputy Clerk/Tax Collector Re: Vacation Days.

No date, Francesco A. Maceri, Fire Chief Elect re: Warren G. Kuhle. The committee reviewed the correspondence and prior to the introduction of an ordinance to increase the amount paid to retired firefighters to that which they were receiving as active members the year that they retired, the clerk was instructed to review the records to determine how many retirees would be affected and the cost of the same.

January 5, 2010, Lawrence J. Paladino, Jr. CPWM, Supt. Re: Increase part-time snow plow drivers and snow blowers. Anzevino indicated that the salary ordinance provides for \$10 per hour for the services and at that to increase the amount would require an ordinance amendment and at this time he suggested that the committee refrain from doing so.

January 11, 2010, Lawrence J. Paladino, Jr., CPWM, Supt. Re: Flood Pump Generator Update – Mr. Paladino advised that although Cooper Power Systems provided a quote that was less than the quote obtained from Rapid Pump and Meter that the Cooper was unable to supply all of the items requested. Paladino suggested that the Committee move forward with the repair since water is getting into the generator and is concerned that if not repaired immediately that the generator may fail.

Brugger motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to authorize the repair to the Huyler Street Storm Water Pump Station by Rapid Pump and Meter at a cost not to exceed \$5,125.

Anzevino motioned; Maceri seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept and refer to Memorial School for their review and input, correspondence dated January 6, 2010, from Steven R. Rothman, Congressman Re: Applications for Fiscal year 2011 Appropriations Requests. Mr. Brugger suggested applying for funds to purchase a rescue truck for the fire department. Anzevino will contact staff from Rothman's office to arrange a meeting to discuss further.

Anzevino motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept with regret and file correspondence received January 8, 2010 from, Mark Calero, Capt. SHAC Re: Termination of Kevin Kubat as a member of the SHAC.

Eckel motioned; Maceri seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept with regret and file correspondence received January 8, 2010 from, Mark Calero, Capt. SHAC Re: Acceptance of New Member Estephany Estevez.

Brugger motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept and file correspondence received January 8, 2010 from Mark Calero, Capt. SHAC Re: Acceptance of New Member Gary Yannetti.

Anzevino motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept and file correspondence dated December 29, 2009, from Lawrence J. Paladino, Jr., CPWM, Supt. Re: SSO Compliance Evaluation Inspection, and further to authorize Boswell Engineering to assist Mr. Paladino in his preparation for this compliance evaluation.

No date, Francesco A. Maceri, Fire Chief Re: Recommendation that the Township of South Hackensack terminate its Interlocal agreement with the Borough of Wallington for fire/ambulance service to the Garfield Park section of the township and reporting that the fire department has already negotiated terms of an agreement with the Borough of

Hasbrouck Heights, and requesting the Township Committee to authorize Township Attorney David Nasta to assist by drafting a mutual aid agreement between the two fire departments similar to those he drafted in 2009 between other fire departments and South Hackensack Fire Department. Brugger motioned; Maceri seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept the correspondence and authorize David Nasta to prepare a mutual aid agreement between the Borough of Hasbrouck Heights and the Township of South Hackensack for fire and ambulance service to the Garfield Park section of the Township.

## Old Business

### PVSC Agreement

David Nasta reported that the township has had Interlocal Agreement with the Borough of Lodi dating back to 1960 and another dated 1980 that permitted the township to discharge sanitary sewage from the Garfield Park section of the township into Lodi's system for an annual fee. Over a year ago, the PVSC contacted the department of public works and advised that a meter would be installed on the discharge line so that the PVSC could separately meter the flow into Lodi and that the township would be required to pay PVSC directly. The meter was installed and a draft Agreement was received and reviewed. Nasta suggested the scheduling of a meeting with the PVSC to review the Agreement and its terms. Elliot Sachs, P.E., Boswell Engineering will coordinate the meeting and advise.

### FedEx Performance Bond

Nasta reported that the Township received correspondence from FedEx attorney indicating that they would not renew their Performance Bond for 2010. After discussions with the Township Engineer, Nasta sees no reason why the Committee should not accept a reduction in the Performance Bond to \$50,000. The engineer reminded that FedEx is required to submit as built drawings and has not yet done so.

Brugger motioned; Anzevino seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to authorize the reduction of FedEx Performance Bond to \$50,000.

### Community Forestry Management Plan

Since there were several members of the Committee who had not yet had an opportunity to review the final plan so the clerk was instructed to prepare the resolution of approval of the plan for adoption on January 21, 2010.

### NJ SEM

Since no one was certain as to the opt out date deadline, the matter was not discussed.

### SHAC Request for shed installation on township property

Zoning Enforcement Officer DeRiso was in attendance and reported to the Township Committee that he discussed the placement of the shed with zoning board attorney Chandless who advised that although the shed will be placed in a residential zone that

according to zoning code requires a certain set-back, the township does not have to comply with zoning code. Nasta advised that he concurred with Chandless's opinion represented to the Township Committee by Mr. DeRiso.

Maceri motioned; Brugger seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to authorize the installation of a 5 ½ X 7 ¾ foot shed on township property as indicated on the map submitted to the Township Committee by the Ambulance Corps along with its request.

## New Business

### Interlocal Agreement with Wallington for Fire and Ambulance service

The Township will terminate its Interlocal Agreement with Wallington for Fire and Ambulance service since the Borough of Wallington has agreed to provide that service.

### 2010 Municipal Budget

Mayor Anzevino advised that he along with Committee member Eckel will serve on the budget sub-committee and will meet shortly to begin the budget preparation.

## Committee Reports

Greg Maceri, Frank Cagas and Gary Brugger had no report.

Walter Eckel reported the there continues to be a problem with sump pump water being directed to the roadways, freezing and causing a hazard to the public. Eckel said that the matter had been discussed previously by the Township Committee and had involved the township engineer, however, there was no formal action taken by the Committee at that

time. Frank Cagas discussed several possibilities to remedy the problem and strongly suggested the committee take the necessary action to resolve it.

James Anzevino reported that the Housing Authority of Bergen County (HABC) will hold a brief meeting on Tuesday, January 19, 2010 at 1:00 p.m. to advise those interested in the process of applying for senior housing units on Grove Street. He invited all those interested to attend. The Mayor reported that the Consumer Price Index (CPI) will remain constant in 2010 and that since the LOSAP contribution increase is tied to the CPI, there will be no increase this year in the LOSAP contribution made by the Township to those who qualify. Anzevino advised of the following recreation activities that were planned at the reorganization meeting of the recreation commission: February 28<sup>th</sup> ; family ice skating, March 21<sup>st</sup>; Riverdance, March 27<sup>th</sup> Easter Show 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Other matters discussed at the meeting was a suggestion that all recreation employees have CPR training and that a calendar of events will be posted on the township website. Regarding last year's basketball camp, Anzevino reported that although it was a good thing, it will not be held in 2010. There was also a discussion of perhaps using the school library during night gym for those children who would rather go to the library than night gym. Of course, it would be supervised and would require prior approval from Dr. DeFabiis. Anzevino outlined more specifically the two committees that he would like to form and asked anyone interested to speak with him. Regarding this year's budget, Anzevino stated that it will be a tough year. The revaluation of all property will take effect in 2010. He stated that last year (2008) the Township Committee created 2 new positions in the police department: Deputy Chief and a second Captain position that cost the township \$36,000 in annual salary increases. The increase does not include social security, FICA, pension and other benefits associated with a salary increase. With the average property tax creeping up to around \$7,000 per year, and knowing that the township will have difficulty meeting its CAP, he suggested rescinding the establishment of those positions as soon as possible. An approximate savings of \$50,000 annually will be very beneficial. Walter Eckel and Frank Cagas agreed with Anzevino and Frank Cagas instructed David Nasta to prepare an ordinance for introduction on January 21, 2010 to amend the police department organizational structure to eliminate the Deputy Chief and one (1) Captain position for economic reasons.

Lastly, Anzevino motioned; Maceri seconded to appoint Lydia Heinzelman as technical assistant/clerk typist in the clerk's office whose appointment shall be ratified by formal resolution at the January 21, 2010 meeting. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Anzevino, Brugger, Cagas, Eckel, Maceri

## Public Comments

Joseph D'Amico, 11 Agar Place – Complained that for over 1 year there has been a water problem that attracts mosquitoes and in the winter creates a hazardous condition on Agar Place. Although the dpw continues to dump salt, the problem continues. He also expressed his dismay that no one has advised him that he would be replaced as a member of the zoning board. Anzevino apologized that he should have contacted him personally.

John Stefano, Grove Street – Questioned the township committee’s rationale for hiring a separate attorney for labor, litigation, etc. Mayor Anzevino responded that labor counsel was hired to represent the township with regard to PBA negotiations and that other attorneys were hired should the township have a need for their services. Stefano asked if any thought had been given to the consolidation of the zoning and planning boards into one board. Anzevino replied that he was opposed to the consolidation of the boards.

Rob Gilman, Business Agent, Local 11 Teamsters – Gilman objected to the committee’s decision to deny grievance (B40116) filed by Joseph Maglio because it was filed late.

Rob Gilman, Business Agent, Local 11 Teamsters - Objected to the discussion of Angelo Sortino at the meeting wherein the grievance (B40117) was discussed stating that Sortino was not notified that he would be discussed. Nasta replied that Mr. Sortino was not discussed in closed session at the meeting, the merits of the grievance were discussed, but by virtue of the action taken by the Committee to uphold the grievance – the committee rescinded the action taken on December 10, 2009 appointing Angelo as foreman.

The following residents spoke out in favor of Angelo Sortino’s appointment as a foreman: Lonnie Bedell, Joseph D’Amico, and Vincent Stefano

Ray DeRiso volunteered to serve on the Mayor’s sub-committee that will look into ways to bring businesses into the township.

Frank Cagas instructed the clerk to advise all department heads that job performance evaluations are required and that they should be performed by the end of February 2010.

Angelo Sortino advised the Committee that he had no bad feelings for them it was just that he had something taken away from him. He wanted to know if the position were offered again if there would be a procedure.

Anzevino motioned; Brugger seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to end the public comment portion of the meeting and go into closed session.

### Closed Session

Anzevino motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to go into closed executive session for the following specific purposes: Personnel – Troy MacDonald, Personnel – Joseph Maglio (Grievance B40113)

The results of the matters discussed in closed session will be made available to the public upon final approval of the governing body. Minutes were recorded of the closed session matters and may be made available to the public when approved and authorized by the governing body.

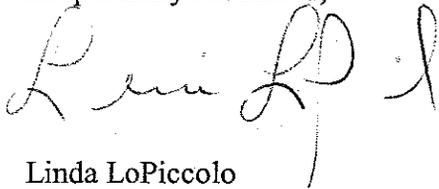
Maceri motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to re-open the meeting to the public at 9:56 p.m.

**Resolution 2010 Authorizing Executive Session January 14, 2010**

A Resolution Providing for a Meeting Not Open to the Public in Accordance with the Provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12.

Whereas, the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack is subject to certain requirements of the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6*, et seq., and

Whereas, the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12*, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution, and

Whereas, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b and designated below:

\_\_\_\_ (1) *Matters Required by Law to be Confidential*: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.

\_\_\_\_ (2) *Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds*: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.

\_\_\_\_ (3) *Matters Involving Individual Privacy*: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

\_\_\_\_ (4) *Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements*: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

\_\_\_\_ (5) *Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds*: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.

\_\_\_\_ (6) *Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property*: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.

X (7) *Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege*: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is require in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

**Resolution No. 2010-049 Denying Department Of Public Works Grievance No. 40116 Dated December 28, 2009**

WHEREAS, on December 28, 2009 the Township Clerk received Grievance No. 40116 (hereinafter “the Grievance”) which was signed and filed by Department of Public Works Laborer Joseph Maglio; and

WHEREAS, there exists between the Township of South Hackensack (“Township”) and Teamsters Local No.11 (the “Union”) a certain contract (the “Agreement”) which governs the rights, duties and obligations of the Township and the Union; and

WHEREAS, DPW Laborer Joseph Maglio (the “Grievant”) is a member of the Union and therefore entitled to the rights and benefits of the aforementioned Agreement; and

WHEREAS, said Agreement, Article 3, sets forth a certain procedure for the adjustment of grievances which requires that the grievant file said grievance within ten (10) days of the action complained of; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee at its public meeting on December 3, 2009 did by unanimous agree require Joseph Maglio to take a fit for duty examination based upon his report that he received certain penalties from the New Jersey Courts related to his rights to operate a motor vehicle within the state and the status of his regular and CDL Licenses; and

WHEREAS, the Grievance was not timely filed in accordance with the Agreement as the complained of action occurred on December 3, 2009 and the grievance was filed on December 28, 2009; and

WHEREAS, Article 3 Section 3 of the Agreement sets forth a grievance procedure (the "Procedure") which first requires the DPW Superintendent to address the Grievance within five days of its filing. It appears that the DPW Superintendent denied said grievance in writing on December 3, 2009; and

WHEREAS, the Procedure thereafter provides that if the Grievance remains unresolved the DPW Commissioner shall have three (3) days from the date that the DPW Superintendent acts to resolve the matter. It appears that the 2009 DPW Commissioner did not act within that time frame which, by Agreement, is a denial of the Grievance; and

WHEREAS, the Procedure thereafter requires the Grievant to request that the Township Committee review the Grievance and despite it having appear that the Grievant did not make such request and in light of the DPW Superintendent taking certain action to suspend the Grievant, the Committee, upon Rice Notice to Maglio addressed the suspension and grievance related to the December 3, 2009 committee action at the Committee's January 7, 2010 meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Committee did meet and discuss the merits of the Grievance and the suspension and made the following findings. First, that the grievance was not timely filed. Second, that the Grievant made no request for the committee to review the denial of his grievance by the Superintendent and the DPW Commissioner. Third, the conduct complained of by way of the grievance does not fall into the context of a matter which can be grieved as it does not constitute a violation of the Agreement. Fourth, that the suspension issued by the Superintendent was necessary and proper as the Grievant does not have the qualifications and capabilities to currently perform the full duties of a DPW Laborer;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack that Grievance No.40116 be and is hereby denied for the foregoing reasons and the suspension of Joseph Maglio is hereby ratified as of January 1, 2010 through and including March 3, 2010.

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2009 the Township Clerk received Grievance No. 40117 (hereinafter "the Grievance") which was signed and filed by Department of Public Works Laborer Joseph Marrella; and

WHEREAS, there exists between the Township of South Hackensack ("Township") and Teamsters Local No.11 ( the "Union") a certain contract ( the "Agreement") which governs the rights, duties and obligations of the Township and the Union; and

WHEREAS, DPW Laborer Joseph Marrella ( the "Grievant") is a member of the Union and therefore entitled to the rights and benefits of the aforementioned Agreement; and

WHEREAS, said Agreement, Article 3, sets forth a certain procedure for the adjustment of grievances which requires that the grievant file said grievance within ten (10) days of the action complained of; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee at its regular public meeting on December 10, 2009 did by resolution appoint DPW Laborer Angelo Sortino to the position of Foreman as the same is defined by the ordinances of the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Grievance was timely filed in accordance with the Agreement on December 18, 2009; and

WHEREAS, Article 3 Section 3 of the Agreement sets forth a grievance procedure (the "Procedure") which first requires the DPW Superintendent to address the Grievance within five days of its filing. It appears that the DPW Superintendent denied said grievance in writing on December 18, 2009; and

WHEREAS, the Procedure thereafter provides that if the Grievance remains unresolved the DPW Commissioner shall have three (3) days from the date that the DPW Superintendent acts to resolve the matter. It appears that the 2009 DPW Commissioner did not act within that time frame which, by Agreement, is a denial of the Grievance; and

WHEREAS, the Procedure thereafter requires the Grievant to request that the Township Committee review the Grievance and it having appears that the Grievant has made said request of the Township Committee and that the Township Committee did obtain the consent of the Grievant through conversation between the Township Attorney and the Grievant's representative, Rob Gillman, of the Union to address the Grievance at the Committee's January 7, 2010 meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Committee did meet and discuss the merits of the Grievance and determined to uphold the same on the basis that the position awarded to Angelo Sortino

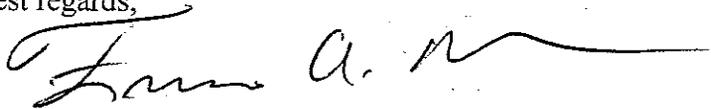
