Call of Meeting to Order

Mayor Anzevino called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. He advised that pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act Annual Notice of the meetings had been provided to *The Record, the Herald and News* and by posting the Annual Notice on the bulletin board in the clerk's office where notices are customarily posted. Everyone saluted the flag. The municipal clerk called the roll.

Gary Vinci, Auditor – Financial Report

Gary Vinci appeared before the Township Committee to report on the 2010 municipal budget preparation and overall what can be expected for this year. He advised that there are two CAPs : a spending cap that requires the adoption of an ordinance to increase spending up to 3.5% , or \$205,000 for South Hackensack's "inside the cap" appropriations; and a tax levy cap that is at 4%. Vinci advised that the governor met today with the assembly and state aid to schools is expected to be cut. Christie wants the schools to use their current surplus in this year's budget. There is no guarantee that the level of state aid will continue.

Regarding revenues, they remained flat in 2009. The Township benefited from a one-time property sale revenue in 2009 of \$190,000 that it will not benefit from in 2010 unless other property is sold. Other increases: PERS \$37,000, NJMC tax sharing

\$32,000, health insurance \$79,000, plus the township must make first payment of \$15,000 toward the revaluation services. The pay down on the debt will increase by \$18,000. Overall increases without salary and other increases is expected to be approximately \$180,000. The principal on the note and the revaluation are outside the CAP.

There were over \$400,000 in tax appeal refunds and currently has no idea what the impact of the current revaluation will have on future tax appeals, there is a potential of multiple year refunds.

The budget introduction deadline has been extended until March 31, 2010. The governor is expected to introduce the state budget by March 18th. We should have a good idea by that time what is coming (or not coming) our way. Preliminary indications are the CMPTRA will be flat this year.

The Township surplus expected to be less than last year but we will not know until the Annual Financial Statement has been filed. It has not yet been filed but is expected with 1 week.

New Business

Towing Ordinance

In response to Chief Frew's request to amend the current tow ordinance, David Nasta was asked to prepare an ordinance amending the current tow schedule in accordance with the recommendation of Chief Frew and distribute to the members of the governing body for their review consideration at the next worksession.

Anzevino motioned; Brugger seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to open the public hearing on Ordinance 2010-01.

Lori Marini, 27 Jackson Avenue – She objected to the adoption of the ordinance. As the sister of one of those effected by the ordinance, she asked the Committee to remember the incident in 1993 at the motel on Route 46 when police officers, including her brother were shot at. She said that the officers go through intensive training and go out every day to protect us. She commented that the school principal makes over \$200,000 and there are only 200 children in the school. She felt that the additional \$50 per household is money well spent for the promotions. She asked if there would be other promotions and the Committee responded no.

Vincent Riotto, 21 Hoffman Street – Objected to the adoption of the ordinance. He said that it will cause financial hardship for the officers involved and that he was in favor of a small increase to pay for the promotions.

Richard Rivera, 408 59th Street, West New York – as a consultant to police departments, received an anonymous email about the ordinance and wanted to voice his objection to it. He asked the Committee several questions about what prompted the change because his feeling was that it was political.

Mayor Anzevino responded that the reasons were financial and economic and that all aspects of the budget will be considered.

Anzevino motioned; Brugger seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to close the public hearing on Ordinance 2010-01 as amended.

Committee Reports

Frank Cagas – Mr. Cagas would like to see the Township's recycling program improved. He suggested that the township consider changing its current recycling program to one that includes many more items. He was advised that the current agreement will expire at the end of this year so it would be a good time to begin discussions regarding this matter. A sub-committee consisting of Mr. Cagas, Mr. Paladino and Mr. Maceri will meet prior to the worksession to discuss options and report back to the Committee no later than September 2010.

Mr. Cagas was concerned about those property owners who throw snow back into the roadway after it has been cleaned by the township and whether or not the township could be held liable for this if someone were to be injured. Mr. Nasta replied that under the Tort Claims Act, there is an exemption for municipalities for snow and ice generally; however, a property owner can be held liable should it be found that they caused the hazardous condition. Anzevino added that the Township needs an overall snow plan.

Greg Maceri told Montenegro, Riotto and Kaiser that he was sorry about their return to former positions and knows that they will be returned to those positions one day.

Gary Brugger reported that the clothing allowance vouchers will be signed this evening for ambulance and fire departments.

Walter Eckel had no report.



ORDINANCE NO. 2010-01 (as amended)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 52 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK ENTITLED "POLICE DEPARTMENT"

WHEREAS, the governing body is charged with the responsibility of determining an appropriate organizational structure for the township's police force; and

WHEREAS, certain changes to the organizational structure of the department were made in December 2008 by the then township committee without a written analysis or reasoning by the Chief of Police or an independent report or analysis of need or cost; and

WHEREAS, the township committee is of the opinion that the changes in organizational structure made in December 2008 should have been proceeded by a full analysis of cost impact and impact upon the department by the Chief and/or a qualified independent party; and

WHEREAS, the township committee is aware of the current economic climate, lack of state and local aid, increasing labor costs and impending impact of property revaluation and has determined that in the absence of aforementioned analysis of need that the cost of additional superior officers occasioned by the December 2008 organizational change is not outweighed by the need for the same; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the aforementioned issues not being addressed in December of 2008 and most importantly the unnecessary costs the organizational structure should be restored to the state prior to December 2008;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack that Chapter 52 Section 1 – Police Department- "Establishment, composition, appointments; chain of command." be amended and supplemented as follows:

Section I: Chapter 52-1 shall be amended and supplemented as follows:

- A. – No Change.
- B. The Police Department shall consist of a Chief of Police, Captain of Police, two Lieutenants, five Sergeants and such other patrolpersons as the Township Committee may deem necessary and special police officers as provided by this chapter.
- C. No Change.
- D. No Change.
- E. A patrolperson shall rank below a Sergeant; a Sergeant shall rank below a Lieutenant; a Lieutenant shall rank below a Captain; the Captain shall rank below the Chief. In the event of a vacancy in the office of Chief of Police, the Captain

shall assume the duties of Chief and the command of the department until that vacancy is filled. Any officer inferior to another officer shall obey and perform any and all orders and directions of any officer superior to him or her.

Section II: All ordinance or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of said inconsistency.

Section III: If any portion of this ordinance is found to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction the remainder of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section IV: This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.

Whereas Senate Bill 458 calls for a referendum to consolidate the municipal tax assessor, municipal tax collector, municipal health services and municipal animal control services at the county, and;

Whereas Senate bill 458 does not give the municipality any option if the county voters cast a majority to consolidate, and;

Whereas consolidation would cause unnecessary hardship on citizens who rely on the municipal tax office for information and assistance, particularly the community's senior citizens who depend on tax offices for assistance in completing tax freeze and rebate forms. Without proper study there is no proof that consolidation will save any public money, and;

Whereas, Senate Bill 458 calls for a master plan for the consolidation of the tax assessment and tax collection functions after enactment of the proposal without giving the public the opportunity to review and comment on the proposed master plan, and;

Whereas, current state statutes place responsibility for tax assessment and tax collection under municipal jurisdiction, and;

Whereas, it is the municipalities' responsibility to collect all property taxes due and distribute same to the other taxing authorities, as well as enforcing laws on delinquents, and;

Whereas, current statute provide for the reserve for uncollected taxes to be included in the municipal budget;

Now, therefore, be it Resolved, that the governing body of the Township of South Hackensack, County of Bergen, does hereby oppose the passage and enactment of Senate Bill 458.

Be it Further Resolved that a certified copy of this resolution be sent to Senate President Stephen Sweeney, Senator Jeffrey Van Drew, Chairman of the Community & Urban Affairs Committee and Senator Robert Gordon representing this district as a sign of our opposition to this proposal.






Dear Mr. Cagas:

I would like to report on some of our accomplishments for the month of January. Checked & cleaned Grove Street Ejector Station (daily), checked & cleaned Flood Pumps Rt. 46 & Huyler Street (daily), checked & cleaned Ejector Station in Garfield Park (3 times a week), daily check of sewer lines in both sections of town. Had to clean up Town Hall & senior citizens building, took down all Christmas lights around Town Hall, and picked up 2,060 pounds of trash that was left behind by garbage man.

For the month of January, the Department Of Public Works had 2 pick up days for newspaper, January 12th. & January 26th. On January 12th., the Department Of Public Works used 3 men, 2 trucks, 18 man-hours, 16 gallons of gas, and both trucks rode a total of 62 miles for a total of 7,100 pounds of paper. On the second pick up day, January 26th, the Department used a total of 3 men, 2 trucks, 18 man hours, 16gallons of gas, and both trucks rode a total of 65 miles for a total of 3,560 pounds of paper. For the month of January, the Department Of Public Works picked up a total of 10,660 pounds of paper.

For the month of January, the Department Of Public Works answered 6 ambulances calls. 5 Medical Emergencies and 1 Auto Accident. 8 calls were transported to Hackensack Medical Center. The total man-hours used for the month of January were 4 hours and 20 mins.






