Call of Meeting to Order –

Mayor Romano called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. She advised that pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act annual notice of the meetings had been provided to *The Record, The Herald and News* and by posting the annual notice on the bulletin board in the clerk's office where notices are customarily posted. Everyone saluted the flag. The municipal clerk called the roll.

Mayor Romano personally thanked Mr. Young J. Kim – Bergen County Career Advancement Training, Inc., 25-60 Saddle River Road for his \$3,000 donation to the South Hackensack Police Department for the purchase of new handguns.

**Committee Reports**

James Anzevino – Thanked Mr. Kim for his generous donation to the SHPD for the purchase of guns. He congratulated the clerk for obtaining image processing certification from the state – He thanked Walter Peterson for his service to the Township as a volunteer firefighter and Fire Chief. He welcomed Michael Nasta as the new chief.

Regarding the written opinion submitted by David Nasta, Anzevino indicated that he agreed with most of it, however, he questioned Greg Maceri's participation should the Committee make promotions that would open up a sergeant position in the future. Nasta responded that there would be a conflict if Greg Maceri participated in the consideration of his brother for a vacant position. Since the criteria was changed by the Committee on March 5th, thereby eliminating Carmine Maceri's eligibility for the positions offered, there would be no conflict with Greg Maceri's participation in the selection of the current available positions.

Anzevino questioned why Sgt. Licamara with 1 month less than 15 years experience should be eliminated for consideration for a promotion that is only one rank higher than his current rank, using the current criteria. When Mr. Anzevino commented that he had not yet received a copy of the deposition he requested in the Brando v. Roman litigation, he was told that he could request it from Thomas Hanrahan Esq., the attorney who handled that litigation.

Anzevino asked generally why Chief Frew's recommendation had not been sought regarding the promotions in direct conflict with the Rules & Regulations of the police department. Anzevino motioned; Eckel seconded to request the Chief's recommendation on promotions. The motion failed by the following vote: Ayes: Anzevino, Eckel Nays: Maceri, Roman, Romano

Lastly, Anzevino commented that Mr. Nasta's opinion did not include an opinion with regard to a possible conflict of interest regarding the Roman v. South Hackensack matter. Nasta advised that he is very familiar with the case but did not give an opinion on it since the cause of action was against the Township and not individual officers of the police department, thereby eliminating any potential conflict.

Walter Eckel – Objected to any police promotions especially during the current economic times. He stated that although all men of the department are qualified, the added tax burden on residents is unnecessary and will adversely affect the community. He objected to the creation of new officer positions in the police department. The previous committee's promotions were made to existing positions. Lastly, he brought up a possible safety concern at the gas pumps on Huyler Street, but after discussing the matter with firefighter H. James Riley, was advised that there is no hazardous condition.

Gregorio Maceri – Thanked Walter Peterson for his dedicated service as a firefighter for over 17 years and current chief. Maceri said that the fire department was concerned over certain streets, specifically Kinzley, North Vepek and 4<sup>th</sup> Streets wherein it may be difficult for a fire vehicle to access those streets because of illegally parked vehicles. Chief Frew advised that he would look into the matter.

Gene Roman – no report

Rosina Romano – Mayor Romano again thanked Mr. Kim for his generous donation and welcomed him to the neighborhood.

Regarding the introduction of the 2009 municipal budget, Romano reported that there are some issues that will be addressed over the next few days therefore the budget will be introduced at a special meeting later this month. Regarding the objecting comments made by Anzevino and Eckel, Romano reminded everyone that Chief Frew requested additional officers to reduce overtime. In the past, the department had 21 officers. Currently there are 17. The overtime has been averaging around \$100,000 per year. Also, the transfer of a public works employee into the police department at a salary of \$44,000 per year to replace retiring Sgt. Ulliana earning \$132,000 per year, saving the township \$86,000 for the next year. This former public works employee was earning \$65,000 per year and his salary has been reduced to \$44,000 resulting in additional savings of \$22,000. Additionally, when the mechanic retired from the public works department in 2008, he was not replaced, saving the township approximately \$93,000 including benefits. The township has now privatized vehicle maintenance at a reduced cost. The Committee has tried to restructure departments to run efficiently and has taken all into consideration. The increase in the police positions is approximately \$45,000 and does not think that amount of money was significant considering all the other reductions. She reminded everyone that she tried to implement an Interlocal agreement for the City of Hackensack to provide the Township's dispatching services but that was objected to by several members of the Committee.

## Public Comments

Anzevino motioned; Maceri seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to open the meeting for public comments.

Chief Frew – Advised the Committee that the police department accepted delivery of its new vehicle that was purchased with NJMC MAP Grant funds. He also thanked Mr. Kim for his generous donation to the department for the purchase of handguns.

Lonnie Bedell, 51 Grove Street – Requested a copy of the opinion letter submitted to the Township Committee by David Nasta. A member of the Committee replied that Chief Frew was not being consulted for his recommendation, and Mr. Bedell objected.

Leon Rossi, 403 Chestnut Avenue – He raised his objection to the Township Committee regarding police promotions saying that he has been attending meeting for many months and never hears discussion about reducing taxes. He wanted to know why the Committee did not consider hiring a police officer who had already received academy training, and/or accepting applications from others for the job.

Maceri motioned; Roman seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to close the meeting for public comments.

## Closed Session

Romano motioned; Maceri seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to go into closed executive session at 8:31 p.m.

Maceri motioned; Roman seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to open the meeting to the public at 9:20 p.m.



**Resolution 2009 Authorizing Executive Session March 12, 2009**

A Resolution Providing for a Meeting Not Open to the Public in Accordance with the Provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4–12.

Whereas, the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack is subject to certain requirements of the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4–6*, et seq., and

Whereas, the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4–12*, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution, and

Whereas, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b and designated below:

       (1) *Matters Required by Law to be Confidential*: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.

       (2) *Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds*: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.

       (3) *Matters Involving Individual Privacy*: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

  X   (4) *Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements*: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

#### **DPW Negotiations**

       (5) *Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds*: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.

       (6) *Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property*: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.

       (7) *Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege*: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

  X   (8) *Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship*: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting. **POLICE PROMOTIONS**

       (9) *Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty*: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack assembled in public session on this date, that an Executive Session closed to the public shall be held in the South Hackensack Township Municipal Complex, 227 Phillips Avenue, South Hackensack, New Jersey, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designated above.

It is anticipated that the deliberations conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Committee that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.

establishment where he attempted to purchase cigarettes. One establishment did not sell him the cigarettes. Two establishments sold the cigarettes to the minor.






Dear Mr. Roman:

I would like to report on some of our accomplishments for the month of February. Checked & cleaned Grove Street Ejector Station (daily), checked & cleaned Flood Pumps Rt. 46 & Huyler Street (daily), checked & cleaned Ejector Station in Garfield Park ( 3 times a week ), daily check of sewer lines in both sections of town. Cleaned up Town Hall and Senior's Center. Spread 4 tons of asphalt on potholes. Swept all streets in this section of town. Picked up 740 pounds of trash that was left behind by garbage man.




