Call of Meeting to Order

Mayor Romano called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. She advised that pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act adequate notice of the meetings had been provided to *The Record*, *The Herald and News* and by posting a notice on the bulletin board in the clerk's office where notices are customarily posted. Everyone saluted the flag. The municipal clerk called the roll.

Anzevino motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept and file General Correspondence – April 2008.

Eckel motioned; Maceri seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept correspondence from South Hackensack Fire Department – Re: Paul A. Verduga and approve his acceptance as a member of the South Hackensack Fire Department.

Anzevino motioned; Roman seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept and table until the June Worksession, correspondence dated May 1, 2008, Dennis McNerney, County Executive Re: Volunteer of the Year Award

Eckel motioned; Anzevino seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept correspondence dated May 6, 2008, Joseph Rutch, CDBG Director Re: Reauthorizing for inclusion in Urban County entitlement program.

Anzevino motioned; Roman seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept correspondence dated May 7, 2008, from Lawrence J. Paladino, Jr., CPWM, Superintendent re: Grove Street Sewer Ejector Wet Well Screen, and authorize the repair at a cost not to exceed \$2,870.00

Anzevino motioned; Roman seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to open the Public Hearing on 2008 Approved Municipal Budget.

There were no comments made regarding the 2008 municipal budget.

Anzevino motioned; Maceri seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to close the meeting to public comments on the 2008 Approved Municipal Budget.

Committee Reports

James Anzevino – Advised that Memorial Day Services will be held Monday, May 26th at Veterans Park, Phillips Avenue, and beginning at 11:00 am. Government Day has been re-scheduled for Thursday, May 29th beginning at 8:00 am. 8th grade students will be treated to a pontoon boat ride through the meadowlands, followed by an afternoon of local government activities. Mrs. Dinallo's 1st grade students will visit town hall on Tuesday, May 20th at 1:30 pm. Little Ferry's soccer field is expected to be completed by July 1st for this year's soccer program.

Walter Eckel – Complained that there is a problem with the air conditioning and hot water in the ambulance corps building.

Greg Maceri – Rosina Romano and James Anzevino stepped down from the dais during Mr. Maceri's discussion regarding the school budget. Greg reported that he and Gene Roman have been reviewing the school budget for the past week. They have not yet met with the school board, but has met briefly with Dr. DeFabiis. Maceri indicated that he and Mr. Roman would like to discuss the matter at the school board meeting to be held on Monday, May 12, 2008 at 7:30 p.m. The Township Committee instructed the clerk to advertise a special meeting for the adoption of the necessary resolution regarding the school budget for Wednesday, May 14, 2008 at 5:00 p.m. Following the discussion, Romano and Anzevino returned to the dais to participate in the remainder of the agenda.

Gene Roman – Commended Det. Robert Licamara and Det. Robert Kaiser for a recent arrest involving a home burglary in town.

Public Comments

Chief Frew commended the members of the police department who participated in Bicycle Safety Day. He publicly thanked Restaurant Depot for their generous donation and participation in the event.

Dolly Montenegro, 57 Vreeland Avenue – Expressed concerns about two catch basins that appeared to be very low and was concerned that they required rising before resurfacing. Mayor Romano indicated that she would address her concerns with the engineer. Montenegro commented that she was disappointed to hear that a landscape plan was not included in the school's renovation project and that it will cost additional money.

Lonnie Bedell, 51 Grove Street – He said that he attended a special meeting at the NJMC and was happy to learn that they have eliminated Donald Trump and ENCAP. He questioned whether or not the township has a "pay to play" ordinance. Mr. Carbone replied that the Township does have its own ordinance, rather complies with state law.



Resolution 2008 Authorizing Executive Session

A Resolution Providing for a Meeting Not Open to the Public in Accordance with the Provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12.

Whereas, the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack is subject to certain requirements of the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6, et seq.*, and

Whereas, the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12*, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution, and

Whereas, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b and designated below:

___(1) *Matters Required by Law to be Confidential*: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.

___(2) *Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds*: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.

___(3) *Matters Involving Individual Privacy*: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

___(4) *Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements*: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

___(5) *Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease of Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds*: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.

___(6) *Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property*: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.

___(7) *Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege*: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is require in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

X (8) *Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship*: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.

(9) Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack, assembled in public session on this date, that an Executive Session closed to the public shall be held in the South Hackensack Township Municipal Complex, 227 Phillips Avenue, South Hackensack, New Jersey, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designated above.

It is anticipated that the deliberations conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Committee that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack at a public meeting held on May 8, 2008.

Resolution No. 2008-092 Authorize Inter-Local Agreement with Little Ferry for – Millo Court, First Street

WHEREAS portions of Millo Court and First Street lie within the boundaries of the Township of South Hackensack as well as the Borough of Little Ferry; and

WHEREAS the Borough of Little Ferry and the Township of South Hackensack have jointly agreed that improvements to Millo Court and First Street are necessary; and

WHEREAS it is in the best interest of the Township of South Hackensack to participate with the resurfacing of Millo Court and First Street at an agreed upon amount not to exceed \$12,500 (\$4,500-Millo Court, \$8,000-First Street);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township of South Hackensack that the Mayor be and is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with the Borough of Little Ferry in accordance with the authority granted by N.J.S.A. 40:8-A-1 et. set., the Interlocal Services Act, for the resurfacing of First Street and Millo Court at the agreed upon amount not to exceed \$12,500;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough of Little Ferry shall act as the lead agency for the Interlocal Project.







Checked & cleaned Grove Street Ejector Station (daily), checked & cleaned Flood Pumps Rt. 46 & Huyler Street (daily), checked & cleaned Ejector Station in Garfield Park (3 times a week), daily check of sewer lines in both sections of town. Swept streets in this section of town, Moonachie, & Garfield Park sections. Cleaned up D.P.W. yard and put away all plows for the spring. Cleaned the following areas: trees along Phillips Ave, benches along Phillips Ave, V.F.W. monument, Firemen's monument, sign on the bottom of Phillips Ave ramp, 2 monuments in park, trees in park, trees at the bottom of Phillips Ave ramp, tree's on the island at Lincoln St., tree's and bushes around Town Hall. Cut grass down park, behind school, along Phillips Ave, Town Hall, triangle on the bottom of Phillips Ave ramp, around sign on Phillips Ave, island on Lincoln Street, Green Street, and Alarm Station. Edged & cleaned off all around walking track. Raked out & leveled softball field. Edged & cleaned walking track. Spread 2 tons of asphalt on potholes, put up new signs on E. Wesley Street. Cleaned and cut property on Grove St. Picked-up 3,540 pounds of trash that was left behind by garbage man.

The Department of Public Works cleaned 115 catch basins for the month of April. The following catch basins were cleaned; Huyler, Wesley, Romanelli, Division, James, Schreiffer, Leuning, Green, Chippewa, Central and Horizon Blvd. The 2008 catch basin cleaning project has been completed. For the months of March & April, the Department of Public Works cleaned a total of **328 basins**.


The Department of Public Works used the Meadowlands sewer truck to clean out some storm drain lines. The following storm drain lines were cleaned: James, Romanelli, Green and Division.

For the month of April, the Department Of Public Works had 2 pick up days for newspaper, April 8th & April 22 Th. On April 8th, the Department Of Public Works used 3 men, 2 truck, 18 man hours, 16 gallons of gas, and both trucks rode a total of 74 miles for a total of 4,620 pounds of paper. On the second pick up day, April 24 Th., the Department used a total of 3 men, 2 trucks, 18 man hours, 16 gallons of gas; both trucks rode a total of 78 miles for a total of 5,160 pounds of paper. For the month of April, the Department Of Public Works picked up a total of 9,780 pounds of paper.

For the month of April, the Department Of Public Works answered 14 ambulances calls. 13 Medical emergencies and 1 auto accident. 11 calls were transported to Hackensack Medical Center, 2 calls were transported to Valley Hospital in Ridgewood, and 1 call was a transported to Holy Name Hospital in Teaneck. The total man hours used for the month of April were 13 hours and 50 mins.

The Township of South Hackensack used a total of 1,505 gallons of unleaded gas and 172 gallons of diesel fuel for the month of April.







Dear Mayor Romano & Council Members:

Bergen County is scheduled to re-qualify as an Urban County entitlement group under the Community Development Block Grant Program for the three year period beginning July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2012. It is expected during that period Bergen County will receive approximately \$30 million to undertake essential community development and assistance activities.

In addition to CDBG funds, municipalities participating in the County's entitlement program are also part of the HOME Program consortium. The HOME Investment Partnership Act is expected to provide approximately \$9.3 million to Bergen County over the next three years for affordable housing projects. Municipalities may only participate in the HOME Program through the County.

Your current agreement contains an automatic renewal clause. Therefore, the only action required by the municipality, is to adopt a resolution stating its intent to continue as a participant in the Urban County entitlement program. A sample resolution is attached for your use.

Federal regulations, also, require the County to notify each municipality that it has the option to elect to be excluded from the CDBG entitlement program.

The municipality's decision to reauthorize inclusion in the program or electing to be excluded will be effective for three years covering the program years 2009, 2010 and 2011. The municipality will not be eligible for Community Development Block Grant Funds or HOME Program Funds for the three year period if it elects to be excluded. In addition, since the amount of the grant funds is based on those municipalities participating in the CDBG program, any exclusion will effectively reduce funds available.

Municipalities authorizing inclusion in the County CDBG Program are not eligible to apply for grants under the Small Cities or State CDBG program.

There are presently seventy participating municipalities in the Bergen County Community Development Program. Municipalities, their residents, and businesses benefit from programs such as the Home Improvement Program, "American Dream" Homeownership Program, Small

Business Economic Development Program, various public service programs, as well as capital improvement projects. In addition, a number of municipalities participate in the program simply because their participation brings additional funds into the region and county.

In order to calculate Bergen County's fair share entitlement grant for FY 2009, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development needs to know the number of participating municipalities. Therefore, we must receive your Resolution of your intent to continue in the programs, no later than May 23, 2008. There can be no waivers of this deadline.

If your municipality elects to be excluded from the CDBG entitlement program, you must notify this office and HUD in writing by May 23, 2008.


