Call of Meeting to Order

Mayor Romano called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. She advised that pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act annual notice of the meetings had been provided to *The Record, The Herald and News* and by posting the annual notice on the bulletin board in the clerk's office where notices are customarily posted. Everyone saluted the flag. The municipal clerk called the roll.

Correspondence & Reports

Maceri motioned; Roman seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept and file the General Correspondence for April 2009 and Department Reports submitted for April 2009.

Eckel motioned; Maceri seconded and the Committee unanimously accepted correspondence dated April 24, 2009, from Ray DeRiso, Secretary, South Hackensack Relief Assoc - 2008 Active Firemen Membership Report and Green Sheet Update

Anzevino motioned; Maceri seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept correspondence dated April 27, 2009, from Robert Serio, Chief SHAC Re: Removal of Vanessa Ferreira from the LOSAP Program for failure to submit a contract.

Roman motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept and approve the request dated May 5, 2009, from Michael D. Frew, Chief of Police Re: Recommend appointment of James P. Donatello as part time dispatcher.

Eckel motioned; Anzevino seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to May 8, 2009, John F. Kopec, 2nd Alternate, Zoning Board of Adjustment Re: Letter of Resignation effective immediately.

Public Hearing

Public Hearing 2009 Approved Municipal Budget – Anzevino motioned; Maceri seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to open the public hearing on the approved 2009 Municipal Budget.

Mayor Romano advised that the budget will be amended prior to its adoption since the Committee has decided to pay the pension bill in full rather than defer payment as previously decided. Funds to pay the bill have been appropriated from the proposed sale of land (\$130,000) and \$140,000 that was set aside in reserve from construction fees.

Lonnie Bedell, 51 Grove Street – Asked where the \$140,000 was generated to pay the pension bill. Rosemarie Giotis, CFO responded that the funds were taken out of 2008 reserve.

Since there were no other comments, Anzevino motioned; Roman seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to close the public hearing on the 2009 Approved Municipal Budget.

Committee Reports

Walter Eckel – Called upon several VFW members present who made a special presentation of a jacket and plaque to Committee Member Anzevino naming him as an honorary member in appreciation for all he has done for the VFW Post 8005. Anzevino was surprised by the presentation and thanked the members for the recognition.

Eckel inquired about the replacement of parking signs throughout the township and asked why the project had not yet been completed by the DPW. Roman replied that the list of streets had been provided to the department by the police and he will notify Mr. Paladino to complete the project and ask for a status report of those streets that have been completed to date.

Greg Maceri – Advised that the Township will begin collecting paper from Memorial School. The Township purchased recycling containers and placed them at the school.

Public Comments

Kim Rerecich, 67 Dyer Avenue – Asked the status of possible safety classes that was discussed by the Committee several months ago. Mayor Romano replied that she would speak with Avis LoVecchio, Recreation Commissioner about her follow-up.

Joanne DeGrosa, 51 Dyer Avenue – Asked if the street in front of the senior citizen housing project could be repaired better. She advised that Shari DePalma had discussed an alternate plan to connect to the storm drain but understands that she will proceed according to the plan.

Mr. Sebastian objected to the overnight parking ordinance that the township has adopted and continues to enforce. He feels that having to obtain a visitor parking sticker every two weeks is burdensome.



Resolution 2009 Authorizing Executive Session May 14, 2009

A Resolution Providing for a Meeting Not Open to the Public in Accordance with the Provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12.

Whereas, the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack is subject to certain requirements of the *Open Public Meetings Act*, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6, et seq., and

Whereas, the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12*, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution, and

Whereas, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b and designated below:

____(1) *Matters Required by Law to be Confidential*: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.

____(2) *Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds*: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.

____(3) *Matters Involving Individual Privacy*: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

____(4) *Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements*: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

____(5) *Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds*: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.

____(6) *Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property*: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.

X (7) *Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege*: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer. Safer Properties v. TSH -- Sewer User Appeal

X (8) *Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship*: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.

____(9) *Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty*: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific

civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack assembled in public session on this date, that an Executive Session closed to the public shall be held in the South Hackensack Township Municipal Complex, 227 Phillips Avenue, South Hackensack, New Jersey, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designated above.

It is anticipated that the deliberations conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Committee that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack at a public meeting held on May 14, 2009.

RESOLUTION NO. 2009-125 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF RIGHTS OF WAY AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK AND FIBER TECHNOLOGIES NETWORKS, LLC TO PERMIT THE INSTALLATION, USE AND MAINTENANCE OF TELECOMMUNICATIONS FACILITIES WITHIN PUBLIC RIGHTS-OF-WAY FOR PURPOSES OF PROVIDING TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

WHEREAS, Fiber Technologies Networks, L.L.C. ("Fibertech"), a New York limited liability company, with offices located at 300 Meridian Centre, Rochester, New York, is authorized to provide local exchange and interexchange telecommunications services throughout the State of New Jersey pursuant to an Order issued by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("NJBP") in Docket No. TE05080683 dated September 14, 2005; and

WHEREAS, Fibertech has requested the consent of the TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK for permission to occupy public rights-of-way within the TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK for a period of fifty (50) years for the purpose of constructing, installing, operating, repairing, maintaining and replacing a telecommunications system; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the best interest of the TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK and its citizenry, particularly including the commercial and industrial citizens, for the TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK to grant municipal consent to Fibertech to occupy the public rights-of-way within the TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK for this purpose; and



Resolution No. 2009-129 Opposing the next Parole Date – Joseph McGowan

WHEREAS, on April 19, 1973, Joan Angela D'Alessandro, a resident of Hillsdale, Bergen County, then 7 years old was brutally assaulted and murdered by her neighbor, Joseph McGowan while delivering Girl Scout cookies; and

WHEREAS, Joseph McGowan, a former high school chemistry teacher, is currently incarcerated for the killing of Joan Angela D'Alessandro; and

WHEREAS, Joan Angela D'Alessandro's mother, Rosemarie D'Alessandro has worked effortlessly for 15 years to persuade the New Jersey Parole Board to keep Joseph McGowan behind bars; and

WHEREAS, his release was denied in 1993, 1998, 2002, and 2008 the parole hearing found that Joseph McGowan was unwilling to take responsibility for murdering his neighbor; and

WHEREAS, Joseph McGowan has never shown any remorse for his crime and has made no substantial progress in addressing the issues that led him to murder Joan Angela D'Alessandro and has demonstrated a substantial risk for recidivism. Joseph McGowan has even been characterized as having the personality of a mass murder; and

WHEREAS, Joan's family should not be made to relive this horrible crime every few years when there is a parole hearing. They continue to suffer unnecessarily on Joseph McGowan's account; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the efforts of Rosemarie D'Alessandro, the Township of South Hackensack hereby supports the position that Joseph McGowan should not be granted another parole hearing for a minimum of thirty-five years. The rape and murder of an innocent child is a serious crime that demands justice; and the family of Joan Angela D'Alessandro should be given the peace of mind knowing that their child's murderer will remain behind bars for another thirty five years before he can be eligible for parole.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Township of South Hackensack hereby abides by the conclusion that the next eligible parole date of Joseph McGowan should not be for a minimum 35 years from now, otherwise this creates a grave injustice to the family of Joan Angela D'Alessandro as well as to society.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution shall be sent to the New Jersey State Assembly, all surrounding municipalities, the Bergen County Police Chiefs Association, the New Jersey PBA, New Jersey State Senate, Bergen County Prosecutor, and to Chairman Peter J. Barnes Jr. of the NJ State Parole Board.



I would like to report on some of our accomplishments for the month of April. Checked & cleaned Grove Street Ejector Station (daily), checked & cleaned Flood Pumps Rt. 46 & Huyler Street (daily), checked & cleaned Ejector Station in Garfield Park (3 times a week), daily check of sewer lines in both sections of town. Cleaned up D.P.W. yard and put away all plows for the spring. Cleaned the following areas: trees along Phillips Ave, benches along Phillips Ave, V.F.W. monument, Firemen's monument, sign on the bottom of Phillips Ave ramp, 2 monuments in park, trees in park, trees at the bottom of Phillips Ave ramp, tree's on the island at Lincoln St., tree's and bushes around Town Hall. Cut grass down park, behind school, along Phillips Ave, Town Hall, triangle on the bottom of Phillips Ave ramp, around sign on Phillips Ave, island on Lincoln Street, Green Street, and Alarm Station. Edged & cleaned off all around walking track. Spread fertilizer and seed around town hall, monuments, and park. Spread 25 tons of clay on softball field. Picked-up 4,180 pounds of trash that was left behind by garbage man.



On the second pick up day, April 28 Th., the Department used a total of 3 men, 2 trucks, 18 man hours, 16 gallons of gas; both trucks rode a total of 59 miles for a total of 3,980 pounds of paper. For the month of April, the Department Of Public Works picked up a total of 9,700 pounds of paper.

For the month of April, the Department Of Public Works answered 8 ambulances calls. 8 Medical emergencies. 6calls were transported to Hackensack Medical Center, and 2 calls refused medical aid. The total man hours used for the month of April were 3 hours and 25 mins.



I went back early in the morning while it was 22° F outside and the temperature in the house were still reading 70° F - 78° F depending on the room. The complainants' sister said that new tenants moved into the apartment upstairs and since then the heat has been fine. I advised the tenant to get in touch with PSE&G to check the thermostat because it seems the thermostat may be hooked up backwards. Abated.

Garbage/Mice




