Committee Reports

All members of the Township Committee expressed their deepest condolences to the Patsy Mei family. Pat Mei passed away earlier in the week. He served as a member of the police department for over 25 years before retiring in 1997.

Walter Eckel had no other comments or report.

Gary Brugger reported on the delivery of the new fire engine. He advised that there is a power steering issue since a much larger pump has been installed that must be corrected prior to delivery. Delivery is expected early next week.

Frank Cagas expressed his happiness that the Committee has finally introduced a shade tree ordinance that will among other things establish a shade tree commission.

Mayor Anzevino thanked Frank Cagas for being the driving force behind the shade tree legislation. He congratulated Jamie DiPiazza for appointment as a member of the zoning board of adjustment. He requested everyone to make a suggestion for a volunteer of the year award that will be presented in the fall in Bergen County.

Regarding pending state legislation that will effect the Township of South Hackensack for many years to come, Anzevino requested that all department heads, employees and residents attend the very important upcoming public forum that will be held at the Bergen County Academies on Wednesday, August 18, 2010 from 7-9 p.m. He urged everyone to come out and show their support for this bill that will eliminate the payment made by the Township to the New Jersey Meadowlands Commission and increase ratables by merging

portions of the Borough of Teterboro with the Township of South Hackensack and other surrounding towns.

Public Comments

Connie Zisa and her friend John Guerriero were in attendance and inquired about Mr. Guerriero's application for housing at the senior housing on Grove Street project. The clerk requested Mr. Guerriero's contact information and advised that she would reach out to the HABC for a status update on his application.

John Burke, Sievers Lane – Objected to the recent driveway widening that the Township Committee authorized saying that it eliminated 2 parking spaces from the street. The Mayor asked the zoning enforcement officer to look into the matter and advise. In addition, the police department will look into whether the recommendation made by Officer Chinchar requiring the sign on Sievers Lane to be moved has been completed.

Vincent Stefano, 75 Grove Street – Asked the Committee to look into federal funding for teachers and police officers. Mayor Anzevino replied that he had already looked into that funding project and it was for teachers only.

Ray DeRiso, Zoning Enforcement Officer – Updated the Committee on the matter regarding the cemetery on Moonachie Road. He advised that he and construction official H. J. Riley spoke with the owner who advised that he will provide engineer's letter. The problem continues. Mr. Riley contacted the Bergen County Soil Conservation Dept. but has not yet had a reply. DeRiso reported that the cemetery owner will obtain zoning and necessary permits since he has not yet done that.

Kim Rerecich, 67 Dyer Avenue – Asked if the ordinance introduced will regulate trees on private property or just those trees owned by the Township. Nasta replied that it will regulate trees within the right of way and on municipal property, but in addition will include new developments and certain other project.

Anzevino motioned; Brugger seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to end the meeting for public comments at 8:15 p.m.

Closed Session

Maceri motioned; Brugger seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to go into closed session at 8:15 p.m.

Minutes were recorded of the closed session matters and will be made available to the public when permitted by law and authorized by the governing body.

Eckel motioned; Anzevino seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to re-open the meeting at 8:40 p.m.

Adjournment

Brugger motioned; Anzevino seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to adjourn the meeting at 8:40 p.m.

Dear Mr. Cagas:

First and foremost, I would like to thank Commissioner Frank Cagas for responding 2 emergencies we had last week, and I would also like to thank councilman Gary Brugger and his worker for helping us with the repair of a caved in storm drain grate on the corner of Grove and Huyler Street.

I would like to report on some of our accomplishments for the month of July. Checked & cleaned Grove Street Ejector Station (daily), checked & cleaned Ejector Station in Garfield Park (3 times a week), and a daily check of sewer lines in both sections of town. Cleaned up Town hall & Senior's Room. Watered all flowers on Huyler Street. Cut grass down park, behind school, along Phillips Ave, Town hall, triangle on the bottom of Phillips Ave ramp, around sign on Phillips Ave, island on Lincoln Street, Green Street, Alarm Station, and edged & cleaned all around walking track in park. Cut bushes around town hall, and along fence on Phillips Ave ramp and picked up 1,380 lbs of trash that was left behind by garbage man.

The Department of Public Works cleaned the following dead ends.

15. Dead end of Garfield Pl


The Department of Public Works filled potholes on the following streets:

For the month of July, the Department Of Public Works had 2 pick up days for newspaper, July 13th & July 27th. On July 13th, the Department Of Public Works used 3 men, 2 trucks, 18 man hours, 16 gallons of gas, and both trucks rode a total of 71 miles for a total of 6280 pounds of paper. On the second pick up day, July 27th, the Department used a total of 2 men, 1 truck, 12 man hours, 8 gallons of gas; one truck rode a total of 34 miles for a total of 2,980 pounds of paper. For the month of July, the Department Of Public Works picked up a total of 9,260 pounds of paper.

For the month of July, the Department Of Public Works answered 9 ambulances calls. 7 Medical emergencies, 1 transportation from Hackensack to Taylor Ave, and 1 building collapse. 2 calls were transported to Hackensack Medical Center, 2 calls were transported to Holy Name Hospital in Teaneck, 1 call was a transportation to Bergen Regional Hospital in Paramus, 1 call refused aid, and 1 call was a building collapse in Hackensack. The total man hours used for the month of July were 12 hours 40 mins.



In order to provide the public with an opportunity to express their thoughts on the "Meadowlands Regionalization, Efficiency and Property Tax Relief Act of 2010", we are hosting a town hall style meeting on **Wednesday, August 18th at the Bergen County Academies, John Greico Auditorium, located at 200 Hackensack Avenue, Hackensack, NJ from 7-9pm.** We welcome area residents to attend and look forward to hearing their feedback on this important issue. The principal objective of the "Meadowlands Regionalization, Efficiency and Property Tax Relief Act of 2010" is to promote tax fairness. The bill proposes dissolving the Borough of Teterboro and reallocating its \$382 Million in tax ratables to Little Ferry, South Hackensack, Hasbrouck Heights and Moonachie, which would lead to substantial reductions in property bills in those communities. The current taxpayers in Teterboro would be shielded from higher tax rates through a 20-year tax abatement. The bill would also address inequities in the Meadowlands Tax Sharing Formula.

This legislation, S-2078/A2939, passed the Senate and Assembly Budget Committees at the end of June and awaits consideration by both houses.

As we move forward in the legislative process, please be assured that we will carefully consider the suggestions and concerns of residents, business and community leaders and elected officials. We look forward to this meeting as an opportunity to hear from area residents and hope they will share their views on this legislation and engage in a meaningful dialogue regarding consolidation and shared services in New Jersey. On Thursday, August 5th 2010 at a township meeting you mentioned that the overtime for the police department was too much for the month of July. I realize that you are concerned for the budget and you mentioned a way to save overtime was to go to one man tours.

Captain Terraccino is in charge of the departmental overtime and he has been doing a fine job in keeping the overtime as low as possible. We have officers (Deputy Chief, Captain, and Lieutenant) working as patrol officers. The Police Department is trying its best to keep the overtime down as much as possible.

In the year 2008 the Police Department had a total of 1,198 hours in overtime. In the year 2009 the Police Department had a total of 829.5 hours in overtime. So far the total overtime for the year 2010 through the month of July is 409.5 hours. As the Township Committee is aware the staffing of the Police Department has been reduced.

I am very concerned not only about the overtime budget, but for the safety of the township residents and the safety of the police officers. Mayor, I'm sure that the safety of the residents and the police officers is also a concern of yours. I strongly object on having a one man patrol. I'm sure the township committee wants to sit down with the contract committee and work something out to resolve this issue.

_____(3) *Matters Involving Individual Privacy*: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of

a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

___(4) *Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements*: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

___(5) *Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds*: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.

___(6) *Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property*: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.

X (7) *Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege*: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.


