Maceri motioned: Roman seconded and the Committee unanimously accepted and placed on file the correspondence dated August 7, 2008 from James Riley regarding the curb cut at 4 Hegner Court

Roman motioned; Anzevino seconded and the Committee unanimously accepted the Monthly Department Reports & Correspondence for July 2008

Old Business

DPW Truck-County Auction

Anzevino reported that he spoke with Mr. Paladino and the DPW will keep the old truck for now until the new truck is fully functional. Anzevino indicated that at this time the old truck will not be released for the auction.

RFP/RFQ – Vending Machines

Mayor Romano informed the public about a request for vending machines at Veteran's Park. Jack Carbone had prepared a generic request for proposals for Beverage Vending Machine Services in Municipal Facilities and Public Recreation Area.

Anzevino motioned; Maceri seconded and the Township Committee accepted this request and authorizes the purchasing agent to take the necessary action to accept RFP/RFQ for vending machines.

New Business

Club 213 Inc. t/a Johnny A's Players Club- Notice of ABC Charges

Carbone had indicated the NJ Division of ABS has issued a formal complaint against the owners and licensees for various issues with state laws and local ordinances and NJ Div. of ABC is seeking the revocation of the license plus a 1090 day suspension. The licensee must respond to the Division on these charges within 30 days. Resolution No. 2008-139 refers to Chapter 104 of the townships local ordinance and sites similar allegations as to those in the ABC report with regards to prostitution, entertaining without a license, and managers allowing immoral conduct to occur on the premise. Said resolution was read in full and attached to that resolution is all supporting documents.

Anzevino motioned: Roman seconded to adopt Resolution No. 2008-139 regarding the licensing of entertainers, managers, and operator of Club 213 Inc.

Carbone indicated that the Police Department should be commended for carrying through a thorough investigation and that the 5 ladies charged for prostitution have pleaded guilty.

Senior Housing

Mayor Romano stated that the town received the documents that they had been waiting for and they are now under review by the committee and the town attorney. The developer has made a request to have a trailer on-site and to start construction with regards to environmental remediation. Carbone indicated the County will approve the documentation around September 11th. Prior to that approval even though there are still some open issues that need to be resolved; Carbone recommends that the Mayor authorize the completeness of the documents and the satisfaction with the negotiations so that the developer can be granted this request.

Eckel motioned: Maceri seconded to authorize the request from the developer for an on-site trailer and approval to start construction regarding environmental remediation. All in favor and no one opposed.

Resolution 2008-133 Authorizing Executive Session

A Resolution Providing for a Meeting Not Open to the Public in Accordance with the Provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12.

Whereas, the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack is subject to certain requirements of the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6, et seq.,* and

Whereas, the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12,* provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution, and

Whereas, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b and designated below:

____(1) *Matters Required by Law to be Confidential:* Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.

____(2) *Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds:* Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.

____(3) *Matters Involving Individual Privacy:* Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of

a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

(4) Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

(5) Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease of Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.

(6) Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.

X (7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is require in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

X (8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.

(9) Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack, assembled in public session on this date, that an Executive Session closed to the public shall be held in the South Hackensack Township Municipal Complex, 227 Phillips Avenue, South Hackensack, New Jersey, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designated above.

It is anticipated that the deliberations conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Committee that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.


I would like to report on some of our accomplishments for the month of June. Checked & cleaned Grove Street Ejector Station (daily), checked & cleaned Ejector Station in Garfield Park (3 times a week), and a daily check of sewer lines in both sections of town. Swept streets in this section of town, Moonachie, and Garfield Park sections. Cleaned up Town hall & Senior's Room. Cut grass down park, behind school, along Phillips Ave, Town hall, triangle on the bottom of Phillips Ave ramp, around sign on Phillips Ave, island on Lincoln Street, Green Street, Alarm Station, and property on Grove Street. Edged & cleaned all around walking track in park. Trimmed all bushes by VFW and Firemen's monument, Town Sign, along fence in park, and Town hall. Picked up 7,300 lbs of trash that was left behind by garbage man.

For the month of June, the Department Of Public Works had 2 pick up days for newspaper, June 10th & June 24th. On June 10th, the Department Of Public Works used 4 men, 2 trucks, 24 man hours, 16 gallons of gas, and both trucks rode a total of 83 miles for a total of 5,600 pounds of paper. On the second pick up day, June 24th, the Department used a total of 3 men, 2 trucks, 18 man hours, 16gallons of gas; both trucks rode a total of 89 miles for a total of 4,520 pounds of paper. For the month of June, the Department Of Public Works picked up a total of 10,120 pounds of paper.

For the month of June, the Department Of Public Works answered 16 ambulances calls. 12 Medical emergencies, 1 Fire Call, 1 Motor Vehicle Accident, 1 Medical Transportation, and 1 Asst. 11calls were transported to Hackensack Medical Center, 1

call was transported to Holy Name Hospital in Teaneck, 1 call was a transportation from Hackensack Medical Center to 35 Jackson Ave, 1 call was a stand by at 275 Huyler Street, 1 call was to Asst. party who fell. Be advised that 2 of the 16 calls was a mutual aid call for the City of Hackensack. The total man hours used for the month of June were 7 hours 5 mins. 2022/248







THE FOLLOWING IS WHAT HAS TRANSPIRED OVER THE PAST MONTHS

The 20/20 Mitigation Plan that has been in the works since last year is complete. The Meadowlands Commission has sent the plan to the state for approval. Once this is approved we will be notified and an ordinance will need to be created to adopt this. I will be attending a county meeting in September regarding the progress.

NIMS' training is continuing. Our main list has been updated as well as copies of certificates on file. Committee members need to take ICS 100 IS 700 and ICS 402 ICS for Executives. We are still in compliance and able to receive funds as we have several certified in all ICS courses and an active training program. The ICS 300 is 24 hours long and the heads of the departments are required to take this class. All other responders need to be to the level of ICS 200. At this time we have several township employees and or volunteers certified in ICS 300. I have sent another letter to the department heads, would like to discuss how we will proceed this year and upcoming years. Incident Command Classes have been set up throughout the county, I will be sending a list to each department heads, and some of these sessions will require payment. The next part of the NIMS program will be position training. I will be attending a state meeting to discuss this and where we are going.

Over the past couple months I attended several meetings. They were on EMS& OEM. I attended a special session with Bergen County OEM regarding the new scanning system that will be utilized at scenes of emergency. This is an accountability system that will be used to track resources as well as personnel. Attended a session from the National Sheriff Assoc. regarding the jail evacuation and their evacuation routes that may impact the South Hackensack Area.

There will be 2 Conferences in October followed by the League of Municipalities in November in which I will be attending.

The Office of Emergency responded to several incidents this past month and has placed reports on file at the office. The Office of Emergency Management has logged a total of 175 Hours this past month. 40 Hours have been dedicated to training and 36 hours attending meetings.

There were two severe storms in which township departments were involved, I would like to congratulate each department for their response and their professionalism during these dangerous storms. Once again our emergency services worked for the better of the community.

The Office of Emergency Management maintains daily checks of the Green Street Ditch and twice weekly checks of The Saddle River Ave Bridge,

Met with Gail of Memorial School to update their emergency operations plan. It has not been updated in some time; the new additions will be added. We are also looking at doing several exercises with the school to test their plan.

On a sadder note The Director Jerry Schwartz of the Bergen County EMS Training Center died this past month, I attended his wake and funeral. Very moving, family was very appreciated the show of emergency vehicles.

Our office is located in the Ambulance Building, our phone number is still 201-440-1815 ext 165 please leaving message and someone will return you call. I am still setting up the office and files. All databases have been updated.

I have been working with Linda and Kevin with sending information for the website; more information will be forthcoming shortly. Several new articles have been placed on the web-site under the public safety icon with the dept. for OEM. The web-site is www.southhackensacknj.org/oem

Please check the website frequently as there will be more articles coming up on the spring season to include Hurricane Season. We are also looking into an e-mail notification list to be used in times of storms and emergencies,

When I am not in the area either on vacation or attending a class, the town is not without coverage. Chief Frew is available and is in communications with me. If anyone would like to volunteer to assist with emergency management, please call our office at 201-440-1815 ext.165.

As you can see the Office of Emergency Management is being placed into more and more situations involving planning, preparedness, response, recovery and mitigation.

Information on all types of hazards is available at our office. Please call or e-mail michaelshoem1@aol.com.

South Hackensack Safety Committee Report:

As a reminder safety is the responsibility of everyone managers, supervisors, employees, volunteers and our residents and business community. If anyone sees any safety hazards please report them to either the police department, DPW, Township Clerk or OEM.

Safety Tips were sent to department heads and committee to review and send to employees.

Loss Control Report received and reviewed, corrections were made and Commerce was notified.

Memo to all department heads to discuss the In House Training Program that is provided to all municipal employees. At a suggestion I met with each department head to see what they needed.

Safety Incentive Report sent in to Commerce.

Right to Know Survey for the township was done in July by Commerce Risk. New fire extinguisher program sent to Mayor for approval. Just last week met with Commerce Rep in regards to the MSI database. All information will be inputted than each department head will be able to track and register their employees or volunteers for classes.

Also a video program will be set up for 2009.



Edged & cleaned all around walking track in park. Spread 75 tons of mulch in playground area. Cleaned up dead ends and picked up 4,760 lbs of trash that was left behind by garbage man.

For the month of July, the Department Of Public Works had 2 pick up days for newspaper, July 8th & July 22nd. On July 8th, the Department Of Public Works used 2 men, 1 truck, 12 man hours, 8 gallons of gas, and the truck rode a total of 36 miles for a total of 4,040 pounds of paper. On the second pick up day, July 22nd, the Department used a total of 4 men, 2 trucks, 24 man hours, 16gallons of gas; both trucks rode a total of 76 miles for a total of 3,820 pounds of paper. For the month of July, the Department Of Public Works picked up a total of 7,860 pounds of paper.

For the month of July, the Department Of Public Works answered 11 ambulances calls. 9 Medical emergencies, 1 Fire Call, and 1 Motor Vehicle Accident. 9 calls were transported to Hackensack Medical Center, 1 call was a stand by at 17 Hoffman St, and 1

call party refused aid. Be advised that 3 of the 11 calls was a mutual aid call for the City of Hackensack. The total man hours used for the month of July were 4 hours 5 mins.
