Call of Meeting to Order

Mayor Eckel called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:35 p.m. He advised that pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act Annual Notice of the meetings had been provided to *The Record, the Herald News* and by posting the Annual Notice on the bulletin board in the clerk's office where notices are customarily posted. Everyone saluted the flag. The deputy clerk called the roll.

Correspondence & Reports

Brugger motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee present unanimously accepted the request from Senator Lautenberg's office to prepare a resolution for a Moment of Remembrance for the 10th Anniversary of the 9-11 attack. 3 yes – Anzevino, Brugger, & Eckel

Anzevino motioned; Brugger seconded and the Committee unanimously accepted and filed the Proclamation from Governor Chris Christie proclaiming September 11, 2011 as Patriot Day and National Day of Service and Remembrance. The Deputy Clerk read the proclamation.

Brugger motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously accepted to place on file the request from Deputy Chief Montenegro to hire Justin Colombo as part time dispatcher pending his background check.

Anzevino motioned; Brugger seconded and the Committee unanimously accepted the correspondence from Rob Gillman re: Local 11 contact expiration and moved this to New Business.

Brugger motioned; Anzevino seconded and the Committee unanimously accepted and filed the letter dated September 1, 2011 from John Gonnella Re: Advance Waste Systems assignment. David Nasta has spoken to Future about some ongoing issues that need to be resolved and the cleanup of the hurricane for the residents Garfield Place. David will present to the township

committee a resolution to be considered at next month's meeting regarding the transfer to Advanced Waste Systems Inc.

Anzevino motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept and file all General Correspondence and Reports received for August 2011.

Old Business

There was no old business.

New Business

DPW Local 11 Contract Expiration – Mayor Eckel suggested that Gary Brugger and Frank Cagas be on the negotiating committee for this contract. Brugger suggested that the clerk get in touch with Rob Gillman for available dates for them to meet.

FEMA – Gary Brugger reported that Mike Ward is attending a FEMA meeting on Monday in Mahwah with regards to the Hurricane Irene funding reimbursement program and that all department heads should make sure that he has the necessary information to bring to the meeting.

Advanced Waste – Vincent Stefano apologized for being late and wanted to address the issue of Advanced Waste missing the garbage pick-up for many residential homes. Stefano reviewed the reports from the police department regarding the property damage that has occurred since Advanced Waste took over. Nasta reported that Future is aware of the incidents and that he will be sending out a conferring letter to them along with a copy to the township committee.

Committee Reports

Vincent Stefano – He reported that he met with Gary to discuss the police hiring protocols. Gary advised the committee to look over these protocols and to report back to them. He informed the public to use caution because the schools are back in session. He was happy with the conclusion of the garbage removal at Garfield Place. Stefano indicated that the flood proofing of the Garfield Park pump station needs to be addressed.

Frank Cagas – Informed the committee that the generator at the Garfield Pump Station was not in working order. Larry discussed with Frank that the engine is okay and that he would like a different vendor (Suburban) to submit a status report on their findings of the generator. Brugger stated that this would be a good idea because there are other generator companies that want to take the generator back to their shop to analyze at a very costly rate.

Brugger motioned; Stefano seconded to approve the vendor (Suburban) to submit a status report to the town on the Garfield Park generator at a cost not to exceed \$750

Roll Call Vote Ayes: Anzevino, Brugger, Cagas, Eckel, Stefano

Frank Cagas met with Larry Paladino to discuss Veteran's Park improvements. They plan on having the Sheriff's officers remove the weeds in the playground area. They are planning on re-netting the entire playground with new mulch, a few new kiddie rides, possibly two adult work out machines outside the play area, and also keeping the mind the requirements for barrier free access.

James Anzevino - He and Vincent Stefano didn't have time to meet on the Best Practices Checklist because they were busy dealing with issues related to Hurricane Irene. He suggested that it be submitted to the state as is for now and any changes can be drafted for next years cycle. Field Day is proposed to be Saturday, October 1st from 1-5 p.m. The opening of the Little Ferry/So Hackensack Soccer League will be on Sunday September 11th - 10:30 a.m. at the Merhoff Field and at 1:00 p.m. there will be a ringing of the bells and a moment of silence for the 10th Anniversary of September 11th. Jim indicated that all emergency services did a great job during the storm.

Gary Brugger - Gary felt there were a lot of issues and complaints with the Dyer Avenue project and that we should hold off paying them until these matters get resolved. Vincent Stefano spoke with Elliot Sachs from Boswell Engineering on this matter and Elliot indicated that this was a resurfacing project and not a reconstruction project. Gary suggested that Frank and Larry meet with Boswell.

Walter Eckel - Stated that all departments did a great job with the hurricane and thanked all the volunteers their time and services.

Public Comments

Michael Nasta and Bill Regan both complained about the terrible job that English Paving did on Dyer Avenue.

Adjournment

Anzevino motioned; Brugger seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to adjourn the meeting at 9:15 p.m.

**Resolution No. 2011-151 Township of South Hackensack, Bergen County, New Jersey
Joining the National Moment of Remembrance of the 10th Anniversary of September 11th**

WHEREAS, the governing body of South Hackensack expresses their support of the United State's Senate regarding coming together as a Nation and ceasing all work or other activity for a moment of remembrance beginning at 1:00 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time on September 11, 2011, in honor of the 10th anniversary of the terrorist attacks committed against the United States on September 11, 2001; and

September 8, 2011

WHEREAS, at 8:46 a.m., on September 11, 2001, hijacked American Airlines Flight 11 crashed into the upper portion of the North Tower of the World Trade Center in New York City, New York; and

WHEREAS, 17 minutes later, at 9:03 a.m., hijacked United Airlines Flight 175 crashed into the South Tower of the World Trade Center; and

WHEREAS, at 9:37 a.m., the west wall of the Pentagon was hit by hijacked American Airlines Flight 77, the impact of which caused immediate and catastrophic damage to the headquarters of the Department of Defense; and

WHEREAS, at approximately 10:00 a.m., the passengers and crew of hijacked United Airlines Flight 93 acted heroically to retake control of the airplane and thwart the taking of additional American lives by crashing the airliner in Shanksville, Pennsylvania, and, in doing so, gave their lives to save countless others; and

WHEREAS, nearly 3,000 innocent civilians were killed in the heinous attacks of September 11, 2001; and

WHEREAS, tens of thousands of individuals narrowly escaped the attacks at the Pentagon and World Trade Center and, as witnesses to this tragedy, are forever changed; and

WHEREAS, countless fire departments, police departments, first responders, governmental officials, workers, emergency medical personnel, and volunteers responded immediately and heroically to those horrific events; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Department of New York suffered 343 fatalities on September 11, 2001, the largest loss of life of any emergency response agency in United States history; and

WHEREAS, the Port Authority Police Department suffered 37 fatalities in the attacks, the largest loss of life of any police force in United States history in a single day; and

WHEREAS, the New York Police Department suffered 23 fatalities as a result of the terrorist attacks; and

WHEREAS, the impact of that day on public health continues through 2011, as nearly 90,000 people are at risk of or suffering from negative health effects as a result of the events of September 11, 2001, including 14,000 workers and 2,400 community residents who are sick, and tens of thousands of others whose health is being monitored; and

WHEREAS, 10 years later, the people of the United States and people around the world continue to mourn the tremendous loss of innocent life on that fateful day; and

WHEREAS, 10 years later, thousands of men and women in the United States Armed Forces remain in harm's way defending the United States against those who seek to threaten the United States; and

WHEREAS, on the 10th anniversary of this tragic day, the thoughts of the people of the United States are with all of the victims of the events of September 11, 2001 and their families; and

WHEREAS, the lives of Americans were changed forever on September 11, 2001, when events threatened the American way of life; and

WHEREAS, in 2009, Congress and the President joined together to designate September 11 as a National Day of Service and Remembrance under the Serve America Act (Public Law 111-13; 123 Stat. 1460); and

WHEREAS, in September 2009 and 2010, President Obama issued Proclamation 8413 (74 Fed. Reg. 47045) and Proclamation 8559 (75 Fed. Reg. 56463) proclaiming September 11, 2009, and September 11, 2010, respectively, as Patriot Day and National Day of Service and Remembrance; and

WHEREAS, September 11 will never, and should never, be just another day in the hearts and minds of all people of the United States;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the governing body of the Township of South Hackensack, County of Bergen, New Jersey:

- (1) recognizes September 11, 2011, as a day of solemn commemoration of the events of September 11, 2001, and a day to come together as a Nation; and
- (2) offers its deepest and most sincere condolences to the families, friends, and loved ones of the innocent victims of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks; and
- (3) honors the heroic service, actions, and sacrifices of first responders, law enforcement personnel, State and local officials, volunteers, and countless others who aided the innocent victims of those attacks and, in doing so, bravely risked and often gave their own lives; and
- (4) recognizes the valiant service, actions, and sacrifices of United States personnel, including members of the United States Armed Forces, the United States intelligence agencies, the United States diplomatic service, homeland security and law enforcement personnel, and their families, who have given so much, including their lives and well-being, to support the cause of freedom and defend the security of the United States; and
- (5) reaffirms that the people of the United States will never forget the challenges our country endured on and since September 11, 2001, and will work tirelessly to defeat those who attacked the United States; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that on the 10th anniversary of this tragic day in United States history the governing body of the Township of South Hackensack, New Jersey, calls upon all of the people and institutions of the United States to observe a moment of remembrance on September 11, 2011, including (i) media outlets; (ii) houses of worship; (iii) military

organizations; (iv) veterans organizations; (v) airlines; (vi) airports; (vii) railroads; (viii) sports teams; (ix) the Federal Government; (x) State and local governments; (xi) police, fire, and other public institutions; (xii) educational institutions; (xiii) businesses; and (xiv) other public and private institutions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the governing body of the Township of South Hackensack, New Jersey, encourages the observance of the moment of remembrance to last for 1 minute beginning at 1:00 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time by, to the maximum extent practicable ceasing all work or other activity; and marking the moment in an appropriate manner, including by ringing bells, blowing whistles, or sounding sirens.






I hope you will participate by:

Whereas at 8:46 AM, on September 11, 2001, hijacked American Airlines Flight 11 crashed into the upper portion of the North Tower of the World Trade Center in New York City, New York;

Whereas 17 minutes later, at 9:03 AM, hijacked United Airlines Flight 175 crashed into the South Tower of the World Trade Center;

Whereas at 9:37 AM, the west wall of the Pentagon was hit by hijacked American Airlines Flight 77, the impact of which caused immediate and catastrophic damage to the headquarters of the Department of Defense;

Whereas at approximately 10:00 AM, the passengers and crew of hijacked United Airlines Flight 93 acted heroically to retake control of the airplane and thwart the taking of additional American lives by crashing the airliner in Shanksville, Pennsylvania, and, in doing so, gave their lives to save countless others;

Whereas nearly 3,000 innocent civilians were killed in the heinous attacks of September 11, 2001;

Whereas tens of thousands of individuals narrowly escaped the attacks at the Pentagon and World Trade Center and, as witnesses to this tragedy, are forever changed;

Whereas countless fire departments, police departments, first responders, governmental officials, workers, emergency medical personnel, and volunteers responded immediately and heroically to those horrific events;

Whereas the Fire Department of New York suffered 343 fatalities on September 11, 2001, the largest loss of life of any emergency response agency in United States history;

Whereas the Port Authority Police Department suffered 37 fatalities in the attacks, the largest loss of life of any police force in United States history in a single day;

Whereas the New York Police Department suffered 23 fatalities as a result of the terrorist attacks;

Whereas the impact of that day on public health continues through 2011, as nearly 90,000 people are at risk of or suffering from negative health effects as a result of the events of September 11, 2001, including 14,000 workers and 2,400 community residents who are sick, and tens of thousands of others whose health is being monitored;

Whereas 10 years later, the people of the United States and people around the world continue to mourn the tremendous loss of innocent life on that fateful day;

Whereas 10 years later, thousands of men and women in the United States Armed Forces remain in harm's way defending the United States against those who seek to threaten the United States;

Whereas on the 10th anniversary of this tragic day, the thoughts of the people of the United States are with all of the victims of the events of September 11, 2001, and their families;

Whereas the lives of Americans were changed forever on September 11, 2001, when events threatened the American way of life;

Whereas in December 2001, Congress and the President joined together to designate September 11 as Patriot Day (Public Law 107-89);

Whereas September 11 will never, and should never, be just another day in the hearts and minds of all people of the United States: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Senate--

- (1) recognizes September 11, 2011, as a day of solemn commemoration of the events of September 11, 2001, and a day to come together as a Nation;
- (2) offers its deepest and most sincere condolences to the families, friends, and loved ones of the innocent victims of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks;

- (4) recognizes the valiant service, actions, and sacrifices of United States personnel, including members of the United States Armed Forces, the United States intelligence agencies, the United States diplomatic service, homeland security and law enforcement personnel, and their families, who have given so much, including their lives and well-being, to support the cause of freedom and defend the security of the United States;
- (5) reaffirms that the people of the United States will never forget the challenges our country endured on and since September 11, 2001, and will work tirelessly to defeat those who attacked the United States; and
- (6) on the 10th anniversary of this tragic day in United States history--
 - (A) calls upon all of the people and institutions of the United States to observe a moment of remembrance on September 11, 2011, including--
 - (i) media outlets;
 - (ii) houses of worship;
 - (iii) military organizations;
 - (iv) veterans organizations;
 - (v) airlines;
 - (vi) airports;
 - (vii) railroads;
 - (viii) sports teams;
 - (ix) the Federal Government;

- (x) State and local governments;
- (xi) police, fire, and other public institutions;
- (xii) educational institutions;
- (xiii) businesses; and
- (xiv) other public and private institutions; and





I would like to report on some of our accomplishments for the month of August. Checked & cleaned Ejector Station on Grove Street (daily), checked & cleaned Flood Pumps Rt. 46 & Huyler Street (daily), checked & cleaned Ejector Station in Garfield Park (3 times a week), daily check of all sewer lines in both sections of town. Started to weed playground. Swept all streets in this section of town, Moonachie, and Garfield Park sections. Cut grass down park, school, along Phillips Ave, town hall, triangle on the bottom of Phillips Ave ramp, around sign on Phillips Ave, and island on Lincoln Street.


Hurricane Irene came through like a beast. The hurricane dumped over 8" of rain. I would like to thank the township committee for all there support, and the members of the department of public works. These guys went above and beyond the call of duty. The weather conditions that we were forced to work in where the nastiest I've seen in my 31 year career. I would like to thank the police department, and Chief Nasta and the fire department for all there help, and last but by far not least OEM Mike Ward. Mike headed the OEM command center and kept everyone up to date on the storm. Mike is a valuable asset to this community. He works very hard to help the people and he should be compensated for all his hard work.

For the month of August, the Department Of Public Works had 2 pick up days for newspaper, August 9 Th. and August 23 rd. On August 9Th. the Department Of Public Works used 3 men, 2 trucks, 18an hours, 16 gallons of gas, and both trucks rode a total of 59 miles for a total of 4,500 pounds of paper. On the second pick up day, August 23rd, the Department used a total of 3 men, 2 trucks, 18 man hours, 16 gallons of gas; and both

trucks rode a total of 72 miles for a total of 5,268 pounds of paper. For the month of August, the Department Of Public Works picked up a total of 9,760 pounds of paper.

For the month of August, the Department Of Public Works answered 6 ambulance calls. 65 Medical emergencies and 1 DOA. 3 calls were transported to Hackensack Medical Center, 2 calls were transported to Holy Name Hospital in Teaneck, and 1 was a stand by at 636 Huyler St. The total man-hours used for the month of August were 6 hours and 40 mins.






